


# **The Surname Book of Culmer**

## George Culmer - 1692

He was married twice (to Margaret Austin (on Jun 5, 1638 in Stourmouth, Kent) and Elizabeth Andrew (on May 24, 1684 in Canterbury, Kent, following the death of Margaret in 1680)) and had 1 child with Margaret Austin, Daniel. He died on Dec 22, 1692 in Preston, Wingham, Kent (last will and testament: "Source: Archdeaconry Court of Canterbury v.78 f.171 #188979; George Culmer of Preston next Wingham, Kent, yeoman; John Culmer, son, sole Executor give Elizabeth 'my now wife' overly and above what I am bound by bond upon our marriage that my Executor shall pay her if she overlives me all such household goods as she brought me in marriage the poor widowes of Preston the sum of forty shillings; George Minter, son in law and Jane (his wife my daughter); five grandchildren (the children of Richard Saffery and Susannah his wife my late daughter); sons Stephen Culmer and Daniell Culmer; grandson George Culmer son of John Culmer; grandson George Culmer son of Daniell Culmer; property in Preston occupied by Michael Huffham; witnessed 3 July 1690 by Robert Howgill? and Thos? Howell") and was buried at All Saints Church, Church Lane, Stourmouth, Kent on Dec 26, 1692.

## **Children**

### **Daniel Culmer 1662 - 1725**

Daniel was the child of George Culmer and Margaret Austin. He was born in Preston, Kent, England in 1662 and married Benedicta Tucker (with whom he had 3 children: Daniel, William and George) on Sep 19, 1683 in Preston. He died in 1725 and was buried in Stourmouth, Kent on Jan 25, 1725.

## **Grandchildren**

### **Daniel Culmer 1689 - 1745**

Daniel was the child of Daniel Culmer and Benedicta Tucker. He was born in Preston, Kent, England in 1689. He was baptized on Jan 7, 1690 and married Jane Neame (with whom he had 2 children: Daniel and Mary) on Jun 10, 1714 at St Mary The Virgin's Church, Church Street, Eastry, Kent. He died in 1745 in Preston and was buried there at St Mildred's Church on Apr 23, 1745.

### **George Culmer**

George was the child of Daniel Culmer and Benedicta Tucker.

### **William Culmer c1696 -**

William was the child of Daniel Culmer and Benedicta Tucker. He was born c. 1696. He was baptized in Preston, Kent, England on Oct 11, 1696.

## **Great-grandchildren**

### **Daniel Culmer 1718 - 1801**

Daniel was the child of Daniel Culmer and Jane Neame. He was born in Kent, England in 1718. He was baptized in Preston, Kent, England on Nov 20, 1718 and married Sarah Wood (with whom he had 1 child, John) on Feb 2, 1750 in Thanington, Kent. He died on May 19, 1801 in Stourmouth, Kent and was buried there at All Saints Church, Church Lane on May 24, 1801.

### **Mary Culmer c1720 - 1760**

Mary was the child of Daniel Culmer and Jane Neame. She was born in Preston, Kent, England c. 1720. She was baptized on Oct 27, 1720 and married Thomas Chandler on Oct 21, 1745 at St Nicholas Church, Ash, Kent. That is also where she died in 1760.

## **Great-great-grandchildren**

### **John Culmer c1757 - 1841**

John was the child of Daniel Culmer and Sarah Wood. John worked as a laborer. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1757. He was baptized in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent, England on Sep 4, 1757, and married Mildred Adams (with whom he had 2 children: John and Charles) on Mar 27, 1779 in Ash, Kent. On Jun 6, 1841, he lived at his birthplace. He died on Nov 22, 1841 in Kent and was buried in Stourmouth on Nov 26, 1841.


### 3 times great-grandchildren

#### Charles Culmer c1795 - 1880

Charles was the child of John Culmer, a laborer, and Mildred Adams. Charles worked as a gardener. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1795. He was baptized on Nov 8, 1795, and was married to Jane.

Charles spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at Lower Street in Stourmouth on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 45); at his birthplace in 1851 (the same place as his father had been living on Jun 6, 1841); at Lower Street in Stourmouth on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 64 and the head of the household); and in Ash in 1871.

Charles died in Jan/feb/mar 1880 in Eastry, Kent.

#### John Culmer c1781 - 1836

John was the child of John Culmer, a laborer, and Mildred Adams. John was a parish clerk and laborer. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1781. He was baptized on Apr 22, 1781 and married Sarah Hawkes (with whom he had 12 children: John, Elizabeth Davison, Frances, Daniel, Sarah, George, William, Jane, Charles, Henry, Edward and George) on Jan 31, 1801 at St Nicholas, Ash, Kent. He died on Jun 7, 1836 in Stourmouth and was buried there on Jun 12, 1836.

### Charles Culmer c1819 -

Charles was the child of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1819. He was baptized on Oct 18, 1819, and was married to Mary A.

Throughout his life, he lived at his birthplace in 1841, in 1871 (relation to Head of House: Head) (the same place as his mother had been living in 1841), in 1881 (relation to Head of House: HeadMarital Status: Married) and in 1891 (relation to Head of House: Head).

### Daniel Culmer 1809 - 1862

Daniel was the son of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. Daniel worked as a butler. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England on Jun 19, 1809. He was baptized at All Saints Church, Church Lane on Jul 23, 1809, and married Ann Goodchild around Feb 1842 in Eastry, Kent.

Throughout his life, Daniel lived in several places: at Walton House, Eastry, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 30); at 58 High Street, Walmer, Kent on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 41 and a servant in the household); and at The Vicarage, Castleton, Lancashire, England on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 51 and a boarder in the household; Relation to Head of House: Butler) following the death of his wife on Nov 23, 1851. He died on Mar 30, 1862 in Stourmouth.

Declared insolvent around 4th Aug 1851.

## George Culmer c1826 -

George was the child of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1826. He was baptized on Apr 22, 1827.

Throughout his life, George lived in several places: at his birthplace in 1841; in Blean, Kent in 1851; at his birthplace in 1861 (the same place as his mother had been living in 1841); in Preston, Faversham, Kent in 1871; and in Harbledown, Kent in 1881-1901 and on Apr 2, 1911 (age in 1911: 85Marital Status: Widowed; Relation to Head: Father-in-law).

## Henry Culmer c1820 - 1896

Henry was the child of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1820. He was baptized on Dec 17, 1820, and was married to Ann Jane.

Henry spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived at his birthplace in 1851- (the same place as his mother had been living in 1841)1891.

Henry died in Jan/feb/mar 1896 in Eastry, Kent.

## Jane Culmer c1817 - 1873

Jane was the child of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. She was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1817. She was baptized on Jul 20, 1817, and was married twice (to Edmund Griggs (in Oct 1839 in Stourmouth) and Henry Hogbin (in 1849 in Eastry, Kent, following the death of Edmund in Oct/nov/dec 1848)).

Throughout her life, she lived at her birthplace in 1841- and (the same place as her mother had been living in 1841)1871.

Jane died in Jul/aug/sep 1873 in Eastry, Kent.

## John Culmer c1804 - 1871

John was the child of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. John worked as an agricultural laborer. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1804. He was baptized on Apr 1, 1804, and married Phoebe Port (with whom he had 8 children: Charles, George, Harriet, Emma, Jane, Esther, John and Mary) on Sep 9, 1820 at St Mary the Virgin Church, Fordwich, Kent.

John spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Blean on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 36); at Doll House, Blean on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 46 and the head of the household); and on New Road, Blean on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 57, the head of the household) and on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 67 and the head of the household). He died on Jul 2, 1871 in Blean, Kent (stomach Cancer) and was buried there at Ss Cosmus & Damian on Jul 9, 1871.

## Sarah Culmer 1811 -

Sarah was the daughter of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. She was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England on May 8, 1811. She was baptized at All Saints on May 17, 1811 and married William Dadds there at All Saints on Oct 1, 1828.

## William Culmer c1815 - 1896

William was the child of John Culmer, a parish clerk, and Sarah Hawkes. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. 1815. He was baptized at All Saints Church, Church Lane on Jun 11, 1815, and was married to Elizabeth.

William spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in Sholden, Kent in 1851-1871; and in Deal, Kent in 1881 and in 1891.

William died in Jan/feb/mar 1896 in Eastry, Kent.

## 5 times great-grandchildren

### Charles Culmer c1822 - 1881

Charles was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. Charles worked as a farm waggoner. He was born in Hoath, Kent, England c. 1822. He was baptized on Dec 29, 1822, and married Charlotte Coleman, a pauper, (with whom he had 9 children: Ann, Henry, Charles, Elizabeth, Emma, John, George, Jane and Frances) on May 21, 1850 in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent (st. Nicholas At Wade, Kent, England).

Charles spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in St Nicholas-at-Wade in 1841; at Row, Monkton on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 28 and the head of the household); on Monkton Street, Monkton on Apr 7, 1861; and at The Street, St Nicholas-at-Wade on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 48, the head of the household) and on Apr 3, 1881. He died on Aug 17, 1881 on Kent and Canterbury Hospital, Ethelbert Road, Canterbury, Kent (pleurisy) (pleurisy).

**FATAL TERMINATION OF AN ACCIDENT.**—On Friday evening Dr. T. S. Johnson, the city coroner, held an inquest in the board-room of the Kent and Canterbury Hospital, on the body of Charles Culmer, age 158, a waggoner belonging to St. Nicholas. Deceased, it appeared, accompanied by a waggoner's mate named Cayley, was returning home from Canterbury on Wednesday, the 27th July, with a waggon and two horses laden with thatching wood. On arriving at Staines Hill, Sturry, he was in the act of jumping off the shafts to walk up the incline when the wheel caught one of his feet and he was pulled down, both wheels passing over the left side of his body. He got up and said "Oh, dear," and was then placed in a miller's waggon which was passing and taken to the Kent and Canterbury Hospital. On examination it was found that he had a lacerated wound on the lower jaw and left cheek, and another below the eyelid, the ribs and scapula on the left side being also fractured. He progressed favourably until the 16th inst., when he had an attack of pleurisy, and died on the following day. A verdict in accordance with the medical testimony was returned.

## Esther Culmer c1836 -

Esther was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. She was born in Kent, England c. 1836. On Jun 6, 1841, she lived in Blean, Kent (was age 5).

## George Culmer c1824 - c1912

George was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. He was born in Hoath, Kent, England c. 1824 and married Harriet Marten (with whom he had 10 children: John, George, Charles, Harriett, Frederick, Alice, Phoebe Ann, Louisa, Emma and Julia) on Dec 14, 1851 at Ss Cosmus & Damian, Blean, Kent. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

Throughout his life, George lived in several places: in Blean, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 13); at St Thomas Hill, Canterbury, Kent on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 32 and the head of the household); and on Sheldwich Road, Preston, Faversham, Kent on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 45 and the head of the household).

George died c. Nov 1912 in Bridge, Kent.

## Harriet Culmer c1830 - c1904

Harriet was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. She was born in Hoath, Kent, England c. 1830. She was baptized on Oct 31, 1830, and married Benjamin Boodle, an agricultural laborer, (with whom she had 12 children: Francis, George, John, Ann, Edward, Henry, Mary, William, Jane, Esther, Thomas and Alfred) on Oct 29, 1848 at Ss Cosmus & Damian's Church, Blean, Kent.

Harriet spent all of her life in Kent, England. Throughout her life, she lived in several places around the county: at Clapham Hill, Blean on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 21 and the wife of the head of the household); on New Road, Blean on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 31 and the wife of the head of the household) (when she was living with her parents); on Fordwich Lane, Canterbury on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 42 and the wife of the head of the household); in Blean on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 52 and the wife of the head of the household) (the same place as her parents had been living on Jun 6, 1841); and at Plough Row, Harbledown on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 72 and the mother-in-law of the head of the household).

Harriet died c. May 1904 in Bridge, Kent.

## Jane Culmer c1835 - c1862

Jane was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. Jane worked as a house keeper. She was born in Kent, England c. 1835. She was baptized in Hoath, Kent, England on Jan 4, 1835 and married Thomas Cladish around Aug 1861 in Canterbury, Kent. She had 1 child, Phoebe, whose father is unknown.

Throughout her life, Jane lived in several places: in Blean, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 6); at Doll House, Blean, Kent on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 16 and the daughter of the head of the household); and in Blean, Kent on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 25 and a servant in the household) (the same place as her parents had been living on Jun 6, 1841) which is where she died c. Jan 1862. Jane was buried there on Jan 12, 1862.

## John Culmer cAug 1838 -

John was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. He was born in Stourmouth, Kent, England c. Aug 1838. He was baptized in Hoath, Kent, England on Sep 9, 1838. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

Throughout his life, John lived in several places: in Blean, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 2); at Doll House, Blean, Kent on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 12 and the son of the head of the household); and at Union Infirmary, Eastry, Kent on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 73 and a inmate in the household).

## Mary Culmer c1843 -

Mary was the child of John Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Phoebe Port. She was born in Blean, Kent, England c. 1843.

During her life, she lived at Doll House in Blean on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 8 and the daughter of the head of the household); and on New Road in Blean on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 19 and the daughter of the head of the household).

## 6 times great-grandchildren

### Alice Culmer cNov 1864 -

Alice was the child of George Culmer, an agricultural laborer, and Harriet Marten. She was born in Blean, Kent, England c. Nov 1864. On Apr 2, 1871, she lived on Sheldwich Road, Preston, Faversham, Kent (was age 6 and the daughter of the head of the household).







At the time of the 1901 census, the Culmer family resided at 1, Chalk Hole Cottages, Garlinge, Isle of Thanet, Kent. Head of the house was 48 year old Monkton, Isle of Thanet, Kent native Charles Culmer, who was employed as an Agricultural Labourer. In/on SDGW, Arthur's place of birth is shown as Lane, Birchington, Isle of Thanet, Kent, but on the above census and on his service papers, it is recoded as Sarre, Kent. When he enlisted in the Army Reserve (Special Reservists) for 6 years on 17 August 1914, Arthur stated that he was 18 years and 4 months old, employed as a Farm Labourer and that he resided at his fathers house. Having been posted to the 6th (Service) Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment) on 24 August 1914, Arthur then remained in the same battalion until his death. On 27 November 1914, he was appointed an (unpaid) Lance; Corporal, and paid as such on 29 April 1915. After serving for 288 days at home, Arthur

was posted to France on 1 June 1915. On 13 October 1915, Arthur was promoted to be a (paid) Lance Sergeant, and appointed to an Acting Sergeant on; 14 April 1916. Arthur was promoted to the rank of Sergeant on 13 July 1916. Arthur was numbered amongst the 8 officers and 121 other ranks that lost their lives in his battalion on 7 October 1916 The battalion total casualty roll for the day numbered 368. What follows is the War Diary entry for the day: - "Quiet morning. At 1.30 p m the enemy opened heavy machine gun fire and shrapnel barrage on the front line. At 1.45 p m the attack commenced. Very heavy M.G. fire was opened, which held up "C" Company on the right. "A" and "B" companies reached the 1st objective (Rainbow Trench) with fairly heavy casualties but on advancing from 1st to 2nd objectives were completely held up with M.G. fire. Twenty men of "C" Company succeeded in getting into the German trench, with troops from the 61st Brigade, and advanced with them. The 1st objective was held until 12 midnight when the Battalion was relieved by the 6thQueen's."; Captain J.C. Page, the only officer of the battalion who was not either killed or wounded on 7 October 1916, led just forty other ranks from the field of the 'Battle of the Transloy Ridges,' and was later awarded the Military Cross.) with the rank of Sergt. He died on Oct 7, 1916 in Flanders, Belgium (sergeant) and was buried at Bancourt British Cemetery, Bancourt, Hauts-de-France, France after Oct 7, 1916.




*Arthur Thomas Culmer - WWI service record*






A T Culmer WWI War and Victory Medal

**LONDONERS HUMPHRED AT  
CHRISTMAS**

"The noise was enough to wake the whole district," said P.C. Burre, of the Londoners who were summoned by the Christmas Curfew Watch on Tuesday with "noisy and continuously making a loud noise in a street."


Supt. E. M. Burton explained to the Chairman (Mr. J. A. Greenwood) that there had been numerous complaints from residents at Brockleham and Wincing of people staying at the holiday camp at Brockleham causing a disturbance in the early hours.

P.C. Burre stated that at 12.30 a.m. on June 1930, as a result of numerous complaints of residents, he was on duty at Brockleham, when he heard loud singing approaching in the distance. The singers turned into Park Lane and were towards him. "They were singing 'in the shade of the Old Apple Tree,' etc., and the noise was enough to wake the whole district," he said. "It was a dark night and they didn't see me. When they came up to me, I threw my light on them and they stopped with surprise and the light from the lantern. When I expressed the opinion that they were making an excessive noise, they all replied 'but didn't think it was any harm in a summer here. It doesn't look very particular.' I pointed out that neither looks very respectful at one o'clock in the morning."

ALBERT ROBERT BUNNELL, of Elmwood, Brockleham Spa, gave evidence that he had been awakened by the noise.

The names of the delinquents, none of whom appeared, were given as Four Misses BUCKLE, STANLEY WILSON, CHARLES, OLIVE BILLY, ALICE FRANKSON, FREDERICK, and MARGARET WILSON. All were known of speaking to the Bench. They were fined 10s. each, and ordered to show 10s. bail, costs between them.
