

## Edward Dale 1783 - c1870

Edward worked as an agricultural laborer. He was born in Canterbury, Kent, England in 1783, and married Ann Stone (with whom he had 5 children: Edward, Elizabeth, William, Esther and Frances) on Jul 13, 1806 at St Mary Bredin's Church in Canterbury.

Throughout his life, Edward lived in several places: in Chartham Hatch, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 55); on North Lane, Westgate in Canterbury on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 70 and the head of the household); and at Nunnery Cottages in Canterbury on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 84 and the brother of the head of the household). He died c. Jan 1870 in Bridge, Kent and was buried at St Mary, Chartham, Kent on Jan 7, 1870.

## Children

### Edward Dale 1806 - 1894

Edward was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Ann Stone. He was born in Nackington, Kent, England in 1806. He was baptized in Canterbury, Kent, England on Nov 16, 1806 and married Rebecca Crockford (with whom he had 8 children: John, George, Mary, Alfred, Eliza, Edward, Sophia and Sarah Ann) there at St Mary Northgate on Jun 17, 1825. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

Edward spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Chartham Hatch on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 35) and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 44 and the head of the household) (the same place as his father had been living on Jun 6, 1841); at Mount Pleasant, Chartham on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 55 and the head of the household); at The Green, Chartham on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 65, the head of the household) and on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 75 and the head of the household); and at Milton Cottage, Chartham on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 89 and the father in law of the head of the household), when he was living with his daughter Sophia following the death of his wife on Jun 21, 1888. He died on Mar 5, 1894 in Thanington, Kent (senile decay and bronchitis) and was buried at St Mary's Church, Chartham, Kent on Mar 8, 1894.

### Elizabeth Dale c1808 - c1850

Elizabeth was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Ann Stone. She was born c. 1808. She was baptized at St Mary, Northgate, Canterbury, Kent, England on Nov 20, 1808 and married John Rye on Oct 13, 1835 at St Marys, Chartham, Kent. She died c. May 1850 in Bridge, Kent and was buried in Ickham, Kent on Jun 9, 1850.

## Esther Dale c1826 -

Esther was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Ann Stone. She was born in Kent, England c. 1826.

## Frances Dale c1829 -

Frances was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Ann Stone. She was born in Kent, England c. 1829. She was baptized at St Mary, Chartham, Kent, England on Jun 28, 1829.

## William Dale c1825 - c1910

William was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Ann Stone. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. 1825. He was baptized at St Mary on Jun 5, 1825, was married twice (to Charlotte Bolding (possibly not married to her) and Susan Lenone (on Oct 23, 1870 in Chartham)) and had 7 children: Rosanna, Stephen and Bertha with Susan; and Elizabeth Ann, Thomas Henry, James Edward and George with Charlotte. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

William spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Chartham Hatch on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 26 and the head of the household) (the same place as his father had been living on Jun 6, 1841); at Heath Farm Cottages, Canterbury on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 36 and the head of the household); on Parish Road in Chartham on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 45 and the head of the household); at Court Lodge Farm in Chartham on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 56 and the head of the household); and at The Lees, Chilham on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 75 and the head of the household).

William died c. Aug 1910 in East Ashford, Kent.


## Grandchildren

### Alfred Dale c1833 - 1912

Alfred was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. He was born in Chartham Hatch, Kent, England c. 1833. He was baptized at St Mary's Church, Chartham, Kent, England on Mar 3, 1833 and married Charlotte Kennett (with whom he had 5 children: Alfred, Edward William, Thomas, Albert Jack and Esther) on Nov 30, 1856 at St Mildred's Church, Canterbury, Kent. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

Alfred spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at his birthplace on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 9); at New House Farm, Thanington on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 18 and a servant in the household); in Marshside on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 38 and the head of the household); on London Road, Harbledown on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 49 and the head of the household); on Plough Lane, Harbledown on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 59 and the head of the household); at his birthplace on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 67 and the head of the household) (the same place as his father had been living on Mar 30, 1851); and at Shalmsford Street, Chartham on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 79 and the father of the head of the household).

Alfred died on Nov 17, 1912 in Bridge, Kent.

### Bertha Dale 1875 -

Bertha was the child of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Susan Lenone. She was born in Chilham, Kent, England in 1875. On Apr 3, 1881, she lived at Court Lodge Farm, Chartham, Kent (was age 6 and the daughter of the head of the household).

### Edward Dale cNov 1837 - c1915

Edward was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. Edward worked as a bricklayer's laborer. He was born in Chartham Hatch, Kent, England c. Nov 1837, and married Sophia Baldock (with whom he had 6 children: Sophia, Sarah A, Ann Rebecca, Edward, Jane Elizabeth and Harry Edgar) on Sep 22, 1860 at St Gregory, Canterbury, Kent.

Edward spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Chartham in 1841 and in 1851; at his birthplace on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 14 and the son of the head of the household); in Chartham in 1861; at Maygers Row, Chartham on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 23 and the head of the household); at Modern Cottages, Wincheap Street, Thanington on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 33 and the head of the household); in Canterbury in 1881; on Sturry Road, Canterbury on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 44 and the head of the household); in St Mary Northgate, Canterbury in 1891; in Canterbury in 1901; on Sturry Road, Canterbury on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 64 and the head of the household); and in Canterbury on Apr 2, 1911. He died c. Jul 1915 in Canterbury, Kent and was buried there at St Gregory the Great, Old Ruttington Lane on Jul 6, 1915.

## Eliza Dale c1834 -

Eliza was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. She was born in Kent, England c. 1834. On Jun 6, 1841, she lived in Chartham Hatch, Kent (was age 7).

## Elizabeth Ann Dale cNov 1851 - c1918

Elizabeth was the child of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Charlotte Bolding. She was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. Nov 1851. She was baptized at St Mary on Feb 1, 1852, and married John Knowler, a general laborer, (with whom she had 4 children: Arthur John, William Edward, Rosa Ellen and George) there at St Mary on Oct 14, 1873.

Elizabeth spent all of her life in Kent, England. Throughout her life, she lived in several places around the county: at Heath Farm Cottages, Canterbury on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 9 and the daughter of the head of the household); on Parish Road in Chartham on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 19 and the daughter of the head of the household); in Bilting on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 28, the wife of the head of the household) and on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 39 and the wife of the head of the household); at The Lees, Chilham on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 49 and the wife of the head of the household) (when she was living with her father, William); and at Round Oast Cottage, Ospringle on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 59 and the wife of the head of the household).

Elizabeth died c. Nov 1918 in Faversham, Kent.



## George Dale c1828 - 1891

George was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. 1828. He was baptized in Harbledown, Kent, England on May 11, 1828 and married Esther Poysden, a servant, (with whom he had 9 children: George, Mary, Sophia, Sarah Ann, Edward, Esther Louisa, William Thomas, Henry and Leonard) on Oct 13, 1849 at St Mary's Church in Chartham (chartham Parish Church). Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

George spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in Chartham Hatch, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 14), on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 23, the head of the household) (the same place as his father had been living on Jun 6, 1841), on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 32, the head of the household) (the same place as his mother had been living on Jun 6, 1841), on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 42, the head of the household), on Apr 3, 1881 and in 1888. He died on Feb 3, 1891 in Bridge, Kent and was buried in Chartham on Feb 7, 1891.

## George Dale c1859 -

George was the child of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Charlotte Bolding. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. 1859. On Apr 7, 1861, he lived at Heath Farm Cottages, Canterbury, Kent (was age 2 and the son of the head of the household).

## James Edward Dale cFeb 1856 -

James was the child of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Charlotte Bolding. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. Feb 1856. He was baptized on Apr 6, 1856. On Apr 7, 1861, he lived at Heath Farm Cottages, Canterbury, Kent (was age 5 and the son of the head of the household).

## John Dale c1825 - 1872

John was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. He was born in Harbledown, Kent, England c. 1825 and married Mary Kennett in Jan 1857 in Kent. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

John spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Chartham in 1841 and in 1851; in Chartham Hatch on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 26 and the son of the head of the household) (the same place as his father had been living on Jun 6, 1841); and in Northgate, Canterbury in 1861 and in 1871.

John died in Jun 1872 in Canterbury, Kent.

## Mary Dale c1830 -

Mary was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. She was born in Kent, England c. 1830.

## Rosanna Dale 1862 -

Rosanna was the child of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Susan Lenone. She was born in Kent, England in 1862. On Apr 2, 1871, she lived on Parish Road, Chartham, Kent (was age 9 and the daughter of the head of the household).

## Sarah Ann Dale c1843 -

Sarah was the child of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. She was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. 1843. She was baptized on Dec 17, 1843.

Throughout her life, Sarah lived in several places: at her birthplace in 1851; in Chartham Hatch, Kent on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 8 and the daughter of the head of the household); and at her birthplace in 1861.

## Sophia Dale 1840 - c1906

Sophia was the daughter of Edward Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Rebecca Crockford. She was born in Chartham, Kent, England in Oct 1840. She was baptized on Oct 11, 1840, and married Thomas Epps, a laborer on a farm, (with whom she had 5 children: Eliza, Stephen, Emma, Emily and Edward) there at St Mary on Dec 24, 1856.

Sophia spent all of her life in Kent, England. Throughout her life, she lived in several places around the county: in Chartham Hatch on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 0) and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 11 and the daughter of the head of the household); in Thanington in 1861; at Dog Kennel House in Chartham on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 31 and the wife of the head of the household); at her birthplace in 1881 (the same place as her mother had been living in 1871); at Milton Cottage in Chartham on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 50 and the wife of the head of the household) (when she was living with her father, Edward); and at Marlowe Terrace, Thanington on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 63 and the wife of the head of the household). She died c. Aug 1906 in Bridge, Kent and was buried at St Nicholas, Thanington, Kent on Sep 29, 1906.

## Stephen Dale c1871 -

Stephen was the child of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Susan Lenone. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. 1871. He was baptized at St Mary on Aug 6, 1871. On Apr 3, 1881, he lived at Court Lodge Farm in Chartham (was age 9 and the son of the head of the household).

## Thomas Henry Dale 1854 - c1939

Thomas was the son of William Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Charlotte Bolding. Thomas worked as a dock yard laborer. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England on Apr 17, 1854. He was baptized at St Mary on May 6, 1854, and married Jane Laws (with whom he had 5 children: Thomas Henry, Bertha Elizabeth, Lily, Hilda May and Sidney Robert) on Jan 15, 1881 at All Saints, Frindsbury, Kent.

Thomas spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at Heath Farm Cottages, Canterbury on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 7 and the son of the head of the household); at Burnt House Farm in Chartham on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 16 and a servant in the household); at Prentice Street, Strood on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 26 and a lodger head in the household); on Montford Road, Strood on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 36 and the head of the household); on Brompton Lane, Strood on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 46, the head of the household) and on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 56 and the head of the household); and at 13 Glanville Road, Rochester on Sep 29, 1939 (was the head of the household) which is where he died c. Oct 1939. Thomas was buried at Old & Cuxton Road Cemeteries, Strood, Kent in Oct 1939.

Alfred was the child of Alfred Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Charlotte Kennett. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. May 1858. On Apr 2, 1871, he lived in Marshside, Kent (was age 12 and the son of the head of the household).

### Ann Rebecca Dale cNov 1864 -

Ann was the child of Edward Dale, a bricklayer's laborer, and Sophia Baldock. She was born in Thanington, Kent, England c. Nov 1864. She was baptized at St Nicholas on Jan 18, 1865.

During her life, she lived at Modern Cottages, Wincheap Street in Thanington in 1871 and on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 6 and the daughter of the head of the household).

### Bertha Elizabeth Dale cAug 1884 -

Bertha was the child of Thomas Dale, a dock yard laborer, and Jane Laws. She was born in Strood, Kent, England c. Aug 1884, and married Charles Birch around Aug 1909 in Strood. On Apr 5, 1891, she lived on Montford Road in Strood (was age 6 and the daughter of the head of the household).

### Edward Dale cApr 1858 - 1933

Edward was the child of George Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Esther Poysden, a servant. Edward worked as a coal porter. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. Apr 1858. He was baptized on Apr 19, 1858, was married twice (to Mary Downey (on Jun 5, 1877 in South Shields, Durham) and Emily (c. 1900, following the death of Mary Jane in Oct 1897)) and had 3 children with Mary Downey: Agnes, Leonard Arthur and Sidney Albert.

Edward spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Chartham Hatch on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 3, the son of the head of the household) and on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 13 and the son of the head of the household); at Cottage, Milton, Gravesend on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 23 and the head of the household); in Milton, Gravesend in 1891; at 29 Raphael Road, Milton, Gravesend on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 43 and the head of the household) following the death of his wife in Oct 1897; and at 8 Norfolk Road, Gravesend on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 53 and the head of the household).

Edward died on Feb 17, 1933 at 14 Standen Street, Tunbridge Wells, Kent, England.

## Edward Dale cAug 1866 - c1888

Edward was the child of Edward Dale, a bricklayer's laborer, and Sophia Baldock. He was born in Thanington, Kent, England c. Aug 1866.

Throughout his life, he lived at Modern Cottages, Wincheap Street in Thanington in 1871 and on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 4 and the son of the head of the household); and on Sturry Road, Canterbury, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 14 and the son of the head of the household). He died c. Aug 1888 in Canterbury, Kent and was buried there at St Gregory on Aug 15, 1888.

## Edward William Dale cAug 1859 - c1930

Edward was the child of Alfred Dale, an agricultural laborer, and Charlotte Kennett. He was born in Chartham, Kent, England c. Aug 1859. He was baptized on Aug 7, 1859, was married twice (to Susannah Hazelwood (on Nov 11, 1882 in Chilham, Kent) and Mary Knapp (c. May 1908 in Bridge, Kent, following the death of Susannah c. Nov 1906)) and had 3 children with Susannah Hazelwood: Susannah Elizabeth, Edward William Alfred and Sydney. Like his father, he was an agricultural laborer.

Edward spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Marshside on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 11 and the son of the head of the household); on London Road, Harbledown on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 21 and the son of the head of the household); at Prospect Row, Harbledown on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 31 and the head of the household); and at Shalmsford Street in Chartham on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 42, the head of the household), on Aug 1, 1903 and on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 51 and the head of the household) (when he was living with his father, Alfred).

Edward died c. Aug 1930 in Bridge, Kent.

**SHEEP STEALING AT UPPER HARTON.**  
 Edward William Dale was indicted for stealing this sheep, value £12 10s, the property of Thomas Williams, at Upper Harton on 2nd March, 1896. Mr. H. M. P. Cook appeared for the prosecution and Mr. Holder for the defence.—Thomas Williams, living at Upper Harton, deposed that prisoner (Dale) whom he had seen from his farm. Witness had 20 ewes in lease in his field on Monday, the 2nd March. The next morning he only found 19 sheep. He next saw the other sheep he had lost at Lambton and identified them by the E.H. on the shoulder.—By Mr. Holder: He had had the ewes four years. They had not been marked but eight or nine months.—James William Richardson deposed that he worked at selling. He missed the sheep when he saw them at his field. He went to Lambton market on the 2nd March, and on the road saw a man driving some sheep towards Askani. Subsequently he saw them at the market. He saw the man who drove the sheep drive afterwards talking to Dale. He saw Dale mark the sheep.—By Mr. Holder: System shilling was not a fair price for the sheep. He thought the sheep were designed by the other mark.—Charles Faxon deposed that he was a butcher residing at Lambton. On the 2nd March he saw a sheep for sale; they had a good deal of other sheep. Prisoner asked £1 each for them. Witness offered five and eventually bought them for five. Witness paid for these by cheque. Prisoner said he gave a man 5s. to mark them, but did not think he would do it so much.—By Mr. Holder: He thought he offered a fair price for them.—August Packman deposed that he approached Dale on the 2nd March. Witness asked prisoner if he was at Lambton market, and he said: "Yes, I want to keep a horse." Witness found the sheep at Lambton, which were very much shorn.—Superintendent Wood deposed that he was present at Lambton on the 2nd March, when Charles Smith was observed with stealing some sheep and shorned. On the 2nd March he apprehended him.—P.C. Parks deposed that he knew George Smith, and that he worked for prisoner last summer. He saw Smith with prisoner on the 2nd March at Post Bottom. On the 2nd March about twenty to thirty at night, he was down to get some another horse, when he did not recognize.—Mr. Holder submitted that the prisoner's story was true. He said he was asked to sell the sheep as a man he knew by sight but not by name. Why the prosecution had not brought forward the man Smith he could not tell. He mentioned that prisoner's story was the true one.—The jury returned a verdict of guilty, and the Chairman, in sentencing the prisoner, inquired that buyers should be safe from depredations of this kind. Prisoner would be sentenced to six months' hard labour.

 William Harris and Frederick Hill, his employer, appeared to enforce summonses charging them with assisting a boy pilfering, the former by working it and the latter by assisting it to be worked whilst in an outhouse.—Mr. R. M. Mazer again appeared for the defence.—James Halsewell deposed that about 4 p.m. on the 11th of last month he went to the "Flying Horse" stable in company with Inspector Fawell and P.C. Holmes. Witness saw a boy pilfering standing on three legs seeing the rear hind. It was standing on the back and was trembling on both fore knees. The defendant Hill said to the Inspector: "I know I have done wrong and I expect to be punished."—Cross-examined: It was suffering great pain.—William Green, veterinary surgeon residing at Castle Street, stated that he was called by defendant to examine the horse. He found it was lame in the rear hind leg from contusion. He saw the horse last week in the morning near the Castle Market.—Mr. Mazer: Is the horse in a good condition?—Witness: He is improved.—Mr. Mazer said that on the 11th Feb. the horse came into possession of the defendant Hill, by his changing another horse for this one. The horse was taken out of Bourne's yard and was driven to the "Flying Horse" and when near the Star Brewery the defendant noticed the horse was lame.—Edward William Dale stated that on the 11th Feb. he was told by Hill to get a boy pilfering into a cart. Defendant drove the cart and he (witness) sat on the side. There was also a pig in the back of the cart. They drove up Broad Street and past the Castle Market to the "Flying Horse." He did not notice any lameness until he came near the Star Brewery.—Thomas Peckle said he was a butcher at Hurlingham. He was in Bourne's yard on the 11th Feb. and heard the Inspector tell the man to bring the horse out. The horse was taken up and down for five minutes, and the Inspector said the horse appeared all right. This was the whole of the evidence, and the Chairman said they must convict, and a fine was imposed of 10s. in each case and 10s. 6d. costs. A notice of the case was handed over to the Dispensary.

*Bennett v. Stickells.*—Mr. H. Broughton appeared for the plaintiff, a horse dealer, who stated that he was in partnership with a Mr. Dale. On February 14th his partner sold a grey cart gelding to the defendant for 35 guineas. Defendant paid £2 on deposit, and he was to pay the remainder within a fortnight. Subsequently the defendant sent the gelding back with something the matter with its shoulders. It was found when sold. He told defendant that unless he fetched the horse away it would be sold and he credited with the amount. It was sold by Mr. Johnson, and after paying all charges defendant was credited at £13 7s. He now claimed £21 8s., the balance due.—By his Honour: No warranty was given with the horse. The transaction was with Dale, but in his (Bennett's) presence.—Edward William Dale said he sold the horse to the defendant. It was brought back by the defendant's waggoner, and it was afterwards re-sold. At Eltham sale he saw the defendant, who then offered £30 for the horse. It was a nice fresh horse when sold, but in a very different condition when it was returned.—The defendant said he gave the plaintiff £2 to work the horse for a fortnight. If he liked the horse and found it worked well with his other he was to pay 35 guineas. He found the horse was not what it was represented to be, and at the end of the week he returned it.—A waggoner, named Page, called for the defence, said the horse did not suit. He alleged that when he returned it an attempt at bribing was made to induce him to give the horse a good character.—Judgment for the plaintiff.

Mum tells me that Sophia Dale used to enjoy playing cards, but only Dad would play with her. She was taken by Isaac Horne (her son-in-law, my grandfather) to his house from time-to-time by motorbike and sidecar.


