## William Horn

He married Sarah Watton (with whom he had 4 children: William, William, Elizabeth and John) on Jul 2, 1781 at St John the Baptist's Church, Margate, Kent.

## Children

### Elizabeth Horn 1785 -

Elizabeth was the 3rd of 4 children of William Horn and Sarah Watton. She was born on Jan 16, 1785. She was baptized at St John the Baptist Church, Margate, Kent, England on Jan 30, 1785.

### John Horn 1786 - 1867

John was the youngest of 4 children of William Horn and Sarah Watton. John worked as a laborer. He was born in Margate, Kent, England on Apr 10, 1786. He was baptized at St John the Baptist's Church on Apr 30, 1786, and had 11 children with Mary Ann: Thomas, John, Mary Ann, Daniel, William, Elizabeth Emma, Emma, Charles, James, Hannah and George.

During his life, he lived at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 45 and the head of the household); and at 6 Chapel Hill in Margate on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 60 and the head of the household). He died on Dec 19, 1867 in Margate (old age).

This is NOT the John Horn who married Mary Ann Jarrett on 10/10/1819. That Mary Ann was alive and living with John Horn in 1851, whereas this John Horn is alone with his mother in a poor house in 1851.

William was the eldest of 4 children of William Horn and Sarah Watton. He was born on Aug 11, 1782. He was baptized at St John The Baptist Church, Margate, Kent, England on Sep 30, 1782. He died in 1783 and was buried at St John The Baptist Church on Oct 18, 1783.

## William Horn 1783 -

William was the 2nd of 4 children of William Horn and Sarah Watton. He was born on Sep 28, 1783. He was baptized at St John the Baptist Church, Margate, Kent, England on Oct 26, 1783.

## Grandchildren

### Charles Horn c1831 -

Charles was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. He was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1831. He was baptized on Apr 10, 1831.

During his life, he lived at his birthplace on Jun 6, 1841.

### Daniel Horn c1823 -

Daniel was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. Daniel worked as a servant domestic inn. He was born in Chapel Hill, Margate, Kent, England c. 1823. He was baptized in Margate, Kent, England on Sep 23, 1823.

Throughout his life, Daniel lived in several places: at Sprattling Street, St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 26 and a servant in the household); at Alva Cottages, Westwood Hamlet, St Peters, Thanet, Kent on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 47 and the head of the household); at Star Farm, St Peters, Thanet, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 56 and a servant in the household); and at Isle of Thanet Union Workhouse, Minster, Thanet, Kent on Apr 13, 1891 (was age 68 and a inmate in the household).

### Elizabeth Emma Horn c1829 -

Elizabeth was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. She was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1829. She was baptized on Nov 29, 1829. In 1851, she lived at her birthplace (relation to Head of House: Daughter) (the same place as her mother had been living in 1841).

### Emma Horn c1830 -

Emma was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. Emma worked as a servant at home. She was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1830.

During her life, she lived at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 11, the daughter of the head of the household) and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 21 and the daughter of the head of the household).

### George Horn cMay 1839 -

George was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. George worked as a brewery laborer. He was born in Margate, Kent, England c. May 1839, and married Martha Wellard (with whom he had 6 children: George, Mary Jane, Henry William, Fanny, Ellen Martha and Florence) on Nov 5, 1863 in St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent (oct/Nov/Dec).

Throughout his life, George lived in several places: at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 2, the son of the head of the household) and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 11 and the son of the head of the household); at his birthplace in 1861 (relation to Head of House: Servant) (the same place as his mother had been living in 1841); at 76 Queen Street, Ramsgate, Kent on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 31 and the head of the household); at Queen Street, Ramsgate, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 41 and the head of the household); in Ramsgate, Kent in 1891 (relation to Head of House: Head); at Paradise, Ramsgate, Kent on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 61 and the head of the household); and on Ethelbert Road, Ramsgate, Kent on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 71 and the head of the household).

## Hannah Horn c1835 -

Hannah was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. She was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1835.

During her life, she lived at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 6, the daughter of the head of the household) and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 15 and the daughter of the head of the household).

## James Horn 1833 - c1906

James was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. James worked as a brewer's laborer. He was born in Margate, Kent, England in 1833. He was baptized at St John The Baptist Church on Feb 17, 1833, and married Harriet Fox (with whom he had 10 children: James, Maria L, Rosa Louisa, Isabella, Thomas G, Alice, Charles, Arthur Albert, Emily and Pleasant Alice) there at St John the Baptist Church on Apr 21, 1860.

James spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 7, the son of the head of the household) and on Mar 30, 1851 (relation to Head of House: Son); at Hertford Place, Ramsgate on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 34 and the head of the household); on Chapel Road, St Lawrence, Thanet on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 48 and the head of the household); in Ramsgate in 1891 (relation to Head of House: Head); and at Addington Street, Ramsgate on Mar 31, 1901 (marital Status: Married; Relation to Head of House: Head).

Worked as a gardener and drayman for Tomson and Wotton. Fell off the dray 1897, compound fracture of leg.

## John Horn c1822 - c1879

John was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. John worked as an agricultural laborer. He was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1822. He was baptized at St John the Baptist's Church on Oct 2, 1825 and married Charlotte Spratt, a laundress, (with whom he had 3 children: Mary Elizabeth, Herbert James and William James) around Aug 1859 in Thanet, Kent. He also had 1 child, Alice Clara, whose mother is unknown.

During his life, he lived at 6 Chapel Hill in Margate on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 25 and the son of the head of the household); and at Northdown in Margate on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 49 and the head of the household). He died c. May 1879 in Thanet, Kent and was buried at St John the Baptist's Church in Margate on Jun 6, 1879.

## Mary Ann Horn c1822 - 1880

Mary was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. Mary worked as a dressmaker. She was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1822, and married Henry Jayes on Mar 30, 1857 at St John The Baptist Church in Margate.

During her life, she lived at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 15, the daughter of the head of the household) and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 29 and the daughter of the head of the household).

Mary died in 1880 in Thanet, Kent.

## Thomas Horn c1820 - 1901

Thomas was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. Thomas was a farm bailiff, agricultural laborer and grocer. He was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1820. He was baptized at St John The Baptist Church on Nov 5, 1820, and married Elizabeth Warner, a general shopkeeper, (with whom he had 9 children: Elizabeth Alice, Charles, Thomas Warner, Caroline, Emily, Hannah, Harry, Isaac and Ellen Mary Ann) there at St John the Baptist Church on Oct 13, 1849.

Thomas spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Westgate Farm, Acol on Jun 6, 1841; at Bromstone, St Peters, Thanet on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 30 and the head of the household); at Northdown in Margate on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 50 and the head of the household); on Buddles Farm, Dane Court Road, St Peters, Thanet on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 60 and the head of the household); at 194 Reading Street, St Peters, Thanet on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 70 and the head of the household); and at 1 Welbeck Terrace, Reading Street, St Peters, Thanet in 1895 which is where he died on Feb 26, 1901 (senile decay). Thomas was buried in St Peters, Thanet, Kent on Mar 4, 1901.

William was the child of John Horn, a laborer, and Mary Ann. William worked as a policeman. He was born in Margate, Kent, England c. 1827. He was baptized at St John the Baptist's Church on Jul 15, 1827, and had 4 children with Elizabeth Fox: Thomas W, James John, George Charles and Emma.

Throughout his life, William lived in several places: at his birthplace in 1841; at Chapel Hill in Margate on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 13 and the son of the head of the household); at Batty Street, Whitechapel, London, England on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 33 and the head of the household); at 11 Batty Street in Whitechapel on Apr 2, 1871; and at 62 Boundary Road, Ramsgate, Kent on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 73 and the father of the head of the household). He died c. Jan 1905 in Thanet, Kent and was buried in Ramsgate, Kent on Jan 5, 1905 (aged 77).

### Alice Horn 1870 -



She was baptized in Margate, Kent, England on Apr 18, 1869, and married John Griggs, a general laborer, (with whom she had 8 children: William James, Florence May, Alice Maud Mary, Charles Walter, Winifred Doris, Helen Maud, Mary Ann and Mildred Sylvia) there at Holy Trinity Church on Apr 27, 1890.



Caroline was the child of Thomas Horn, a farm bailiff, and Elizabeth Warner, a general shopkeeper. Caroline worked as a domestic cook. She was born in St Peters, Thanet, Kent, England c. Feb 1857. She was baptized on Mar 8, 1857.

Caroline spent all of her life in Kent, England. Throughout her life, she lived in several places around the county: at her birthplace in 1871; in Ramsgate in 1881; at Mount Albion Mews, St Lawrence in Thanet on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 33 and a servant in the household); at 3 Elms Park Terrace, Ramsgate on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 46 and a servant in the household); and at 23 Northdown Road, St Peters in Thanet on Apr 2, 1911 on the same road as her mother who was living at Elder Cottage, 23 Northdown Road.


Caroline died in 1916 in Thanet (apr/May/Jun).

## Charles Horn 1872 - 1956



He was born in Ramsgate, Kent, England on Oct 15, 1872, and married Annie Walker (with whom he had 8 children: Charles G, Pleasant Emily, Herbert Jack, Walter Stephen and Doris Olive, along with 3 surviving children) on Jun 3, 1900 in St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent.

Charles spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: on Chapel Road, St Lawrence, Thanet on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 9 and the son of the head of the household); at London Tavern, Addington Street, Margate on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 18 and a servant in the household); at Nelson Crescent in Ramsgate on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 28 and the head of the household); at 67 Addington Street in Ramsgate on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 39 and the brother in law of the head of the household) (the same place as his mother had been living on Mar 31, 1901); and at 4 Bloomsbury Road in Ramsgate in 1937, on Sep 29, 1939 (was the head of the household), in 1953 and in 1955.

Charles died on May 9, 1956 on Hill House Hospital, Tothill Street, Minster, Thanet, Kent.

Throughout her life, Elizabeth lived in several places: at Bromstone, St Peters in Thanet on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 0 and the daughter of the head of the household); in Ramsgate, Kent in 1871 (relation to Head of House: Servant) and in 1881; and on Royal Road, Ramsgate, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 30 and a servant in the household).

### Emily Horn cNov 1876 -

Emily was the child of James Horn, a brewer's laborer, and Harriet Fox. Emily worked as a domestic general servant. She was born in Ramsgate, Kent, England c. Nov 1876, and married Charles Dale, a general laborer, (with whom she had 4 children: Nellie May, along with 3 surviving children) around 1904.

Throughout her life, she lived on Chapel Road, St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 5 and the daughter of the head of the household); and at Addington Street in Ramsgate on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 25, the daughter of the head of the household) and on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 35 and the wife of the head of the household) (the same place as her father had been living on Mar 31, 1901).

### Emma Horn c1869 -



### Harry Horn 1864 - 1949



He was baptized at St John the Baptist Church, Margate, Kent, England on Mar 26, 1865, and married Mabel Gibson (with whom he had 9 children: William, Florence, John Edwin Ernest, Mabel Ellen Frances, Herbert James Frederick, Kathleen Charlotte, Charles and George Francis, along with 1 surviving child) there at St John The Baptist's Church on Oct 17, 1891.

Herbert spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at his birthplace on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 6 and the son of the head of the household); at Church Street in Margate on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 26 and the head of the household); at 6 Grange Road in Margate on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 39 and the head of the household); at 84 Byron Road in Margate on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 46 and the head of the household); at 3 Princes Crescent in Margate in 1924 and in 1936; and at Iona, Nash Road in Margate on Sep 29, 1939.

Herbert died c. Feb 1942 in Thanet, Kent.



Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at 67 Addington Street in Ramsgate on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 27 and the son of the head of the household) - less than a mile from his sister Rosa Louisa Horn who was living at 62 Boundary Road in Ramsgate; at 30 Royal Road in Ramsgate on Apr 2, 1911 - less than a mile from his cousin on his father's side Harry Horn who was living at 15 Liverpool Lawn in Ramsgate and his sister Rosa Louisa Horn who was living at 77 Hardres Street in Ramsgate -, when he was living with his sisters, Isabella and Isabella; and at 12 King Edward Road in Ramsgate on Jun 19, 1921 (was age 47, the head of the household), in 1923, on Mar 6, 1926, on Sep 29, 1939 (was the head of the household), in 1955 and in 1958.

Arthur served in the military from 1914 to 1918 (rank: Deck Hand; Service number: DA 16075) and in 1921 he was working at George Casley Snack Owner in Sea.

## GALLANT RESCUE.

### COOK SAVES MATE'S LIFE.

The Crosswall of Ramsgate Harbour was the scene of a very gallant rescue on Sunday morning.

The Ramsgate steam trawler *Kestrel* was coming "through bridge," about 10.30, with the object of making for a berth in the Inner Harbour, in order to land and market her catch of fish the following day. The mate, Mr. Daniel George Mynheer, aged 26, of 7, Alfred-cottages, Hardres-street, was on deck at the time. He had divested himself of his sea boots, but was wearing a heavy sea coat.

A rope run out to the dump-head became taut, and the right leg of the mate was caught by a turn. He was flung into the air some distance, and then hurled overboard into the dock.

At that moment the cry of "Man overboard!" went up, as the cook, Arthur Albert Horne, aged 51, of 12, King Edward-road, emerged from his galley. He at once pulled off his boots and dived into the water, swimming to the spot where Mr. Mynheer was struggling, apparently injured, and hampered by his heavy clothing. He had already gone under the surface.

### Assisted into Lifebuoy.

A lifebuoy was thrown, and the cook swam with this to the mate, and assisted him to get it on. It was then Horne's turn, having seen his comrade safely afloat, and preparations being made to get him to safety, to think of his own life. In an exhausted state he reached the side of the *Kestrel*, where one of the deck hands, William West, put a leg over the bulwark. Horne hung on to the limb until a boat came up and completed the rescue of both men.

Mr. Mynheer, who was quite "done up," was afterwards conveyed to the Ramsgate General Hospital by the motor ambulance of the Town Division of the St. John Ambulance Brigade. At first it was feared that his right leg had been fractured, but on examination it was found that he was suffering severely from shock and from extensive bruising of the right leg and right arm.

All the witnesses of this thrilling rescue agree that the courage shown by Mr. Horne was of the highest standard, and that, but for his prompt action, there would be a vacancy for mate on the steam trawler *Kestrel*.





Pleading guilty, Parsons was remanded for a week, with a view to being sent to Borstal for treatment.




Horn Geo. F. 128 Byron av

### **KILLED A MONTH BEFORE RETIREMENT**

#### **EXPLOSION VICTIM TO BE BURIED AT MARGATE**

Stoker Petty Officer John Horn, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert James Horn, of Nash-road, Margate, who sustained fatal injuries in a mysterious explosion on H.M.S. Sheldrake at the Portland Naval Base, on Thursday, will be buried at Margate to-morrow.

A poignant feature of the tragedy was that Horn was due to retire in less than a month after 24 years' service.

A member of an old Margate family, Horn attended Salmestone School as a boy and during his war service was injured at Zebrugga.

The explosion, which took place in the stokehold of the Sheldrake, occurred soon after the oil plants had been lighted for the ship to put to sea. Other men working in the stokehold were showered with burning oil but escaped serious injury.

The interment will take place at Margate Cemetery and will be preceded by a service at the Cemetery Chapel, to be conducted by the Rev. H. J. E. Bowman, Vicar of St. James', Garlinge, and chaplain to the Margate branch of the Royal Naval Old Comrades' Association.

At the inquest at Portland on Saturday on Stoker Petty Officer **John** Edwin Ernest Horn, of H.M.S. Sheldrake, who died from burns after an explosion in the boiler-room of the vessel on February 2, a verdict of "Death by misadventure" was returned.

Chief (Engine-room Artificer Leonard John Holmes said after Horn had applied a torch to the oil furnace the engine-room became a mass of flames.

Lieut.-Commander Arthur Edward Tolfrey Christie said the explosion was caused by Horn's omitting to ensure the special oil fuel sprayer was in place.



After spending his youth farming it was while he was working for a Ramsgate corn and fodder merchant that he met his wife.


