

Thomas was the child of Thomas Page and Elizabeth Marsh. was baptized at St Mary The Virgin, Lydden, Kent, England on Apr 22, 1733 and had 1 child, with Ann: Thomas.

### Thomas Page 1769 -

Thomas was the child of Thomas Page and Ann. He was born in Newington, Kent, England in 1769. He was baptized at St Mary The Virgin, Lydden, Kent, England on Mar 26, 1769, and married Charlotte Johnson (with whom he had 2 children: Thomas and Mary Ann) on Jul 13, 1790 in Monks Horton, Kent. In 1851, he lived in Westwell, Kent (relation to Head of House: Head).

Thomas died in England.

## Great-grandchildren

### Mary Ann Page c1806 -

Mary was the child of Thomas Page and Charlotte Johnson. She was born in Newchurch, Kent, England c. 1806.

During her life, she lived at Cold Ham Farm, Little Chart, Kent on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 35); and in Westwell, Kent in 1851 (relation to Head of House: Daughter).

### Thomas Page c1790 - 1864

Thomas was the child of Thomas Page and Charlotte Johnson. Thomas worked as a laborer. He was born in Newington, Kent, England c. 1790. He was baptized in Newington, Hythe, Kent, England on Jan 30, 1791, and married Caroline Marsh (with whom he had 2 children: Stephen and Caroline Bromley) on Jul 13, 1811 in Folkestone, Kent.

Throughout his life, he lived in Folkestone, Kent in 1841; and in Elham, Kent in 1851 and in 1861 which is where he died in Jan/feb/mar 1864 (not the Thomas Page who died 12/12/1868 - that one was a master mariner).

## Great-great-grandchildren

### Caroline Bromley Page c1821 - 1891

Caroline was the child of Thomas Page, a laborer, and Caroline Marsh. Caroline worked as a laundress. She was born in Uphill, Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1821. She was baptized at St Michael, Hawkinge, Kent, England on May 6, 1821, and married Edmund Tutt, a sawyer, (with whom she had 6 children: Eliza, Jane, James, Sarah Maria, Caroline Bromley and Edmund Thomas) on Apr 11, 1847 at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church Street in Folkestone (folkestone Parish Church).

Throughout her life, Caroline lived in several places: at 40 George Street, Buckland, Kent on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 30 and the wife of the head of the household); at 13 Shooter's Hill, Buckland, Kent on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 40 and the head of the household), when she was living with her daughter Jane following the death of her husband on Dec 21, 1858; and at 18 Clarence Terrace, St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 62 and the head of the household). She died on Sep 24, 1891 at Newlands, St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent (heart disease and senile decay) and was buried there on Sep 28, 1891.

The facts were yesterday (Friday) reported to the deputy-coroner (Mr. H. Fielding) who certified that he did not think an inquest was necessary.**

## Stephen Page 1817 - 1900

Stephen was the child of Thomas Page, a laborer, and Caroline Marsh. Stephen worked as an agricultural laborer. He was born in Newington, Kent, England in 1817. He was baptized at St Nicholas, Newington, Hythe, Kent, England on Jan 26, 1817, and married Mary Butcher (with whom he had 7 children: William Richard, James, Charlotte Ann, Stephen, Mary, John and Sarah Elizabeth) on Aug 13, 1837 at Ss Mary & Eanswith, Folkestone, Kent.

Stephen spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Folkestone on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 20); on Gibraltar Lane, Folkestone on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 34 and the head of the household); on Bank House, Cheriton Road, Cheriton on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 64 and the head of the household); and at Bank Cottage, Cheriton in 1900. He died on Jan 2, 1900 in Elham, Kent and was buried on Folkestone Cemetery, Cheriton Road, Folkestone, Kent on Jan 8, 1900.

#### Charlotte Ann Page cFeb 1842 - 1921

Charlotte was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher.

Charlotte worked as a laundress. She was born in Hawkinge, Kent, England c. Feb 1842. She was baptized in Folkestone, Kent, England on Feb 6, 1842, and married Frederick Goddard, a plumber's laborer, (with whom she had 11 children: Frederick Thomas, George Stephen, John, Elizabeth Jane, Katherine, Stephen Page, Samuel, Louisa J, Ellen Charlotte, Florence Julia and Bertram Charles) there at Christ Church on Sep 10, 1865.

Charlotte spent all of her life in Kent, England. Throughout her life, she lived in several places around the county: on Gibraltar Lane in Folkestone on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 9 and the daughter of the head of the household); on Mill Lane in Folkestone on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 19 and a servant in the household); at Back Berkley Place Cottage in Folkestone on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 27 and the wife of the head of the household); on Foord Road in Folkestone on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 34 and the wife of the head of the household); and at 65 Foord Road in Folkestone on Apr 5, 1891 (was age 48, the wife of the head of the household), on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 59, the wife of the head of the household), on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 69, the head of the household) following the death of her husband on Dec 20, 1908 and in 1919. She died on Jul 27, 1921 at 49 St John's Street in Folkestone.

James was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher. James worked as a mariner. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. Nov 1839. He was baptized at The Parish Church of St Mary and St Eanswythe, Church Street on Dec 8, 1839, and married Elizabeth Warman (with whom he had 5 children: Edmund, James, Elizabeth Sarah Anne, William George and Mary Julia) there at The Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church Street on Oct 5, 1865.

Throughout his life, James lived in several places: at his birthplace on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 1); on Gibraltar Lane in Folkestone on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 10 and the son of the head of the household); at St Johns Street in Folkestone on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 40 and the head of the household); and at High Street, Cheriton, Kent on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 71 and the head of the household).

## John Page 1849 -

John was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher. He was born in Kent, England in 1849. On Mar 30, 1851, he lived on Gibraltar Lane, Folkestone, Kent (was age 2 and the son of the head of the household).

## Mary Page 1847 -

Mary was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher. She was born in Kent, England in 1847. On Mar 30, 1851, she lived on Gibraltar Lane, Folkestone, Kent (was age 4 and the daughter of the head of the household).

## Sarah Elizabeth Page 1853 - 1927

Sarah was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher. Sarah worked as a not occupied for a living. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1853. She was baptized at Christ Church on Oct 30, 1853.

During her life, she lived on Bank House, Cheriton Road, Cheriton, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 27 and the daughter of the head of the household); and at 61 Foord Road in Folkestone on Jun 19, 1921 (was age 67 and the head of the household).

Sarah died on Oct 17, 1927 at 184 Canterbury Road in Folkestone.



Stephen was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1844. He was baptized at St Michael the Archangel Church, Hawkinge, Kent, England on May 12, 1844.

During his life, he lived on Gibraltar Lane in Folkestone on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 6 and the son of the head of the household); and at 43 Grove Road in Folkestone in 1916.

Stephen died on May 7, 1916 in Elham, Kent.





## William Richard Page c1837 - 1907

William was the child of Stephen Page, an agricultural laborer, and Mary Butcher. William worked as a bricklayer. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1837. He was baptized at Ss Mary & Eanswith Church on Nov 19, 1837, was married twice (to Margaret Drake (on Feb 3, 1860 in Folkestone) and Jane Ormrod (on Aug 1, 1887 in Ashford, Kent, following the death of Margaret c. 1881)) and had 3 children with Margaret Drake: William Richard, James Henry and Frederick Stephen.

Throughout his life, William lived in several places: at his birthplace on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 3); at Sandfield House in Folkestone on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 33 and the head of the household); and at 69 Foord Road in Folkestone in 1907. He died on Jul 13, 1907 at Victoria Hospital in Folkestone and was buried at St John The Baptist, Folkestone on Jul 17, 1907.

Edmund was the child of James Page, a mariner, and Elizabeth Warman. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1868. On Apr 3, 1881, he lived at St Johns Street in Folkestone (was age 13 and the son of the head of the household).

### **Elizabeth Sarah Anne Page cAug 1872 -**

Elizabeth was the child of James Page, a mariner, and Elizabeth Warman. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. Aug 1872. She was baptized at Christ Church on Aug 11, 1872, and had 1 child, with Roberts John Kite: Dorothy Maud. On Apr 3, 1881, she lived at St Johns Street in Folkestone (was age 8 and the daughter of the head of the household).

### **Frederick Stephen Page cNov 1863 - 1906**

Frederick was the child of William Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Drake. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. Nov 1863. He was baptized at The Parish Church of St Mary and St Eanswythe, Church St on Dec 6, 1863 and married Margaret Else, a charwoman, (with whom he had 7 children: Frederick William, James Walter, Emma Janet, Thomas Victor, Agnes Jean, Stephen Ernest and Sidney Arthur) there at The Parish Church of St Mary and St Eanswythe, Church St on Jan 23, 1887. Like his father, he was a bricklayer.

During his life, he lived at Sandfield House in Folkestone on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 7 and the son of the head of the household); and at 11 Park Street in Folkestone on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 37 and the head of the household). He died on Jul 10, 1906 at 16 Park Street in Folkestone and was buried at Cheriton Road Cemetery, Cheriton Road, Folkestone on Jul 14, 1906.

### **James Page 1870 -**

James was the child of James Page, a mariner, and Elizabeth Warman. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1870. On Apr 3, 1881, he lived at St Johns Street in Folkestone (was age 11 and the son of the head of the household).

### **James Henry Page 1861 - 1947**

James, also known as Henry Page, was the son of William Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Drake. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on Oct 14, 1861. He was baptized at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church St on Dec 22, 1861, and married Elizabeth Sellis (with whom he had 5 children: William Ernest, Fanny, Stanley Wallace, Hetty Camelia and Frederick Henry) there at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church St on Apr 16, 1882.

During his life, he lived at Sandfield House in Folkestone on Apr 2, 1871 (was age 9 and the son of the head of the household); and at 2 Robins Terrace, Lyminge, Kent in 1947. He died on Dec 13, 1947 in Folkestone and was buried at Ss Mary & Ethelburga, Lyminge, Kent on Dec 17, 1947 (a drizzly day).

Mary was the daughter of James Page, a mariner, and Elizabeth Warman. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on Apr 14, 1878. She was baptized at Christ Church on May 5, 1878. On Apr 3, 1881, she lived at St Johns Street in Folkestone (was age 2 and the daughter of the head of the household).

### William George Page cAug 1874 -

William was the child of James Page, a mariner, and Elizabeth Warman. William worked as a barge man out of work. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. Aug 1874. He was baptized at The Parish Church of St Mary and St Eanswythe, Church Street on Sep 27, 1874.

During his life, he lived at St Johns Street in Folkestone on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 6 and the son of the head of the household); and at High Street, Cheriton, Kent on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 36 and the son of the head of the household) (when he was living with his parents).

### William Richard Page cMay 1860 -

William was the child of William Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Drake. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. May 1860. He was baptized at Christ Church on Jun 24, 1860. On Apr 2, 1871, he lived at Sandfield House in Folkestone (was age 10 and the son of the head of the household).

## 5 times great-grandchildren

### Agnes Jean Page cAug 1898 - 1903

Agnes was the child of Frederick Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Else, a charwoman. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. Aug 1898. She was baptized on Aug 7, 1898. On Mar 31, 1901, she lived at 11 Park Street in Folkestone (was age 2 and the daughter of the head of the household) which is where she died on Jan 6, 1903. Agnes was buried at St John's Church, St John's Church Road, Folkestone on Jan 10, 1903.

### Emma Janet Page 1893 - c1961

Emma was the daughter of Frederick Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Else, a charwoman. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on Apr 14, 1893. She was baptized at St John's Church on Apr 19, 1893, and married Frederick Eade on Oct 27, 1912 at St James, Norlands, London. On Mar 31, 1901, she lived at 11 Park Street in Folkestone (was age 7 and the daughter of the head of the household), when she was living with her sister, Agnes Jean. She died c. Aug 1961 in Canterbury, Kent and was buried at Ss Mary & Ethelburga, Lyminge, Kent on Sep 23, 1961 (an overcast day).

### Fanny Page c1883 -

Fanny was the child of James Page and Elizabeth Sellis. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1883.

### Frederick Henry Page 1891 - 1917

Frederick was the son of James Page and Elizabeth Sellis. Frederick worked as a royal navy stoker. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on Mar 26, 1891. He was baptized at St John The Baptist on Jun 14, 1891, and was married to Unknown. On Apr 2, 1911, he lived at Sailors Home, Dover, Kent (was age 20 and a visitor in the household). During 1917, he was serving in the navy in the Royal Navy with the rank of Petty Officer Stoker.

Frederick died on Mar 23, 1917 (mine explosion; Body not recovered for burial).

Stoker Petty Officer Page, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry James Page, of 35, Ship-st., has been lost at sea. Mr. and Mrs. Page have two other sons serving their King and Country.

### Frederick William Page cMay 1887 -

Frederick was the child of Frederick Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Else, a charwoman. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. May 1887, and was married to Agnes. On Mar 31, 1901, he lived at Park Street in Folkestone (was age 13 and the son of the head of the household).

### Hetty Camelia Page 1889 - 1949

Hetty was the daughter of James Page and Elizabeth Sellis. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on Mar 12, 1889, and married Harold Thompson, a cowman on a farm, (with whom she had 6 children: Ronald Stanley, Joan Marguerite, Alan Aybery and Peter Geoffrey, along with 2 surviving children) around Nov 1909 in Elham, Kent. On Apr 2, 1911, she lived on Osborne Villas, Canterbury Road in Folkestone (was age 24 and the wife of the head of the household).

Hetty died on Jul 28, 1949 in Sholden, Kent.

### James Walter Page cFeb 1889 - c1965

James was the child of Frederick Page, a bricklayer, and Margaret Else, a charwoman. James was a grocer's porter and grocer shop's assistant. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. Feb 1889. He was baptized at Christ Church on Mar 3, 1889, and married Agnes Ades (with whom he had 2 surviving children ) around May 1915 in Elham, Kent.

Throughout his life, James lived in several places: at Park Street in Folkestone on Mar 31, 1901 (was age 12 and the son of the head of the household); on Albert Road in Folkestone on Apr 2, 1911 (was age 22 and the son of the head of the household); and at 14 Park Street in Folkestone on Jun 19, 1921 (was age 32 and the head of the household). In 1921 he was working at C Webb Grocer at 16 Bouretic Rd W, Folkestone.

James died c. May 1965 in Folkestone.

### Stanley Wallace Page 1887 - 1917

Stanley was the son of James Page and Elizabeth Sellis. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on May 13, 1887. He was baptized at St John The Baptist on Aug 28, 1887, and married Beatrice Smith (with whom he had 1 surviving child) around Nov 1910 in Elham, Kent. In 1915, he lived at 113A Canterbury Road in Folkestone. In 1917 he was serving in the military in Iraq (soldier Number: 121686, Rank: Gunner, Corps: Royal Garrison Artillery). He died on Jul 24, 1917 in Baghdad, Iraq (heat Stroke) and was buried there at Baghdad War Cemetery (North Gate) after Jul 24, 1917.


