

Robert Peters 1671 -

He was born in Horsham, Sussex, England in 1671, was married twice (to Ann (possibly not married to her) and Elizabeth Kirk (on Jan 29, 1690 in Rye, Sussex)) and had 3 children: Henry with Ann and Robert and Ann with Elizabeth.

Children

Ann Peters 1692 -

Ann was the younger of 2 children of Robert Peters and Elizabeth Kirk. She was born in Rye, Sussex, England on Dec 14, 1692. She was baptized on Dec 24, 1692.

Henry Peters 1695 -

Henry was the child of Robert Peters and Ann. He was born in Horsham, Sussex, England in 1695 and had 1 child, Charles.

Robert Peters 1691 - 1768

Robert was the child of Robert Peters and Elizabeth Kirk. He was born in Horsham, Sussex, England in 1691. He was baptized in Cowfold, Sussex, England on Oct 8, 1691, and married Elizabeth Fuller (with whom he had 1 child, Ann) on Nov 27, 1716 in Hastings, Sussex (sFHG The Sussex Marriage Index (up to 1837). St. Clements according to IGI).

During his life, he lived in Oare, Sussex.

Robert died in 1768 in Ore, Sussex.

Grandchildren

Ann Peters 1736 - 1809

Ann was the child of Robert Peters and Elizabeth Fuller. She was born in Ore, Sussex, England in 1736 and married her cousin on her father's side Charles Peters (with whom she had 1 child, Henry) on Jun 7, 1755 in Ore.

Ann died in 1809.

Charles Peters 1735 - 1789


Charles was the child of Henry Peters. He was born in Ore, Sussex, England in 1735 and married his cousin on his father's side Ann Peters (with whom he had 1 child, Henry) on Jun 7, 1755 in Ore. That is also where he died in 1789.

Great-grandchildren

Henry Peters 1755 - 1829

Henry was the child of Charles Peters and Ann Peters. He was born in Ore, Sussex, England in 1755 and married Mary Scott (with whom he had 9 children: Mary, Sarah, Henry, Elizabeth, Charles, Jane, William, Benedicta and Harriet) on Dec 6, 1777 at St Mary the Virgin Church, Smeeth, Kent. He died on Sep 8, 1829 in Cheriton, Kent.

Henry Peters was born in Sussex, England and married Mary Scott in Kent, England. Henry and Mary had at least nine children born between 1781 and 1797 in Folkestone, Kent, England. Their daughters, Sarah and Mary, married two men by the last name of Tutt, possibly brothers. According to available records the Peters family all stayed in the Folkestone, Kent area of England and raised their families there. However, their oldest son, Henry, along with his wife and family left for New Brunswick, Canada, probably in the early 1830's. That was about the time that Henry Johnstone is reported to have brought the Kinread and Peters families to that area of Canada (Richibucto, Buctouche, Westmorland areas). The Peters children were: Henry (b 1781) married Mary Standing in Kent, England Sarah (b 1782) married James Tutt (born in Kent, England) Mary (b 1784) married Stephen Tutt (born in Kent, England) Elizabeth (b 1786) married William Willard Charles (b 1788) Jane (b 1790) married Richard Prior William (b 1792) married Ann Andrews Benedicta (b 1795) married John Pope, a bricklayer Harriet (b 1797) married Rob Minnis The Peters children were Christened on the following dates: Henry 9 April 1780 Lyminge, Kent, England. Died 1867 Sarah 14 April 1782 Folkestone, England. Died 1861 Mary 14 February 1784 / 14 March 1784 Folkestone, England. Died 1854 Elizabeth 26 February 1786 Folkestone, Kent, England. Appears to have been convicted of house breaking in 1828 Benedicta married John Pope, a bricklayer Harriet married Robert Minnis, then William Bennett.

Benedicta Peters 1795 - 1850

Benedicta was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1795. She was baptized at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church Street on Oct 11, 1795, and married John Pope, a builder, (with whom she had 6 children: John, William, Susanna, Eliza, Elizabeth and Henry) there at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church Street on Jul 19, 1814 (st Mary and St Eanswyth Church). On Jun 6, 1841, she lived at Fancy Street in Folkestone (was age 45 and the wife of the head of the household). She died on Oct 28, 1850 on Mill Lane in Folkestone (ulceration of the bowels) and was buried at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church Street, Folkestone on Nov 2, 1850.

Charles was the son of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England on Apr 13, 1788.

Charles died in 1814 in Cheriton, Kent.

Elizabeth Peters 1786 - 1880

Elizabeth was the daughter of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in Feb 1786.

Elizabeth died on Jan 21, 1880 in Mulbring, New South Wales, Australia.

Harriet Peters 1797 - 1869

Harriet was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1797 and was married twice (to Robert Minnis (on Jun 29, 1816 in Folkestone) and William Bennett (on Nov 17, 1844)).

Harriet died in Oct/nov/dec 1869 in Elham, Kent.

Henry Peters 1781 - 1867

Henry was the son of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in Apr 1781, and married Mary Standing (with whom he had 6 children: Henry Warman, John, Sarah Ann, Ann, Stephen and Rachel) on May 28, 1803 at SS Mary & Eanswith in Folkestone.

During his life, he lived in Richibucto, Kent, New Brunswick, Canada in 1861. He died on Mar 12, 1867 in Richibucto and was buried there at Methodist Point Cemetery after Mar 12, 1867.

Jane Peters 1790 - 1864

Jane was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. She was born in Broadmead, Kent, England in 1790.

Jane died in 1864.

Mary Peters 1780 - 1854

Mary was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1780, and married Stephen Tutt on Jun 19, 1802 in Folkestone. In 1841, she lived at her birthplace.

Mary died in Apr/may/jun 1854 in Kent.

Sarah Peters c1781 - 1861

Sarah was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. Sarah worked as a nurse. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1781. She was baptized at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe on Apr 14, 1782, and married James Tutt, a farm bailiff, (with whom she had 4 children: James, Edmund, Elizabeth and Maria) there on Oct 3, 1801.

Sarah spent all of her life in Kent, England. Throughout her life, she lived in several places around the county: in Cheriton on Jun 6, 1841; at 5 Shortlands Farm, Beckenham on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 69 and the wife of the head of the household); and at Horn Street, Cheriton on Apr 7, 1861, when she was living with her daughter Maria following the death of her husband on Apr 18, 1856. She died in Oct/nov 1861 in Cheriton, Kent and was buried there on Nov 10, 1861.

William Peters 1792 - 1843

William was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Scott. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England in 1792. He was baptized at Parish Church of St Mary & St Eanswythe, Church St on Dec 9, 1792, and married Ann Andrews (with whom he had 1 child, Harriet) there on Feb 6, 1813.

During his life, he lived in Woolwich, London, England on Sep 4, 1828; and in Australia in 1829. On Apr 18, 1829 he arrived in Sydney Cove, New South Wales, Australia. He appeared in court in Maidstone, Kent, England on Aug 7, 1828 (sentenced Transport to Australia). He died on Nov 14, 1843 in Maitland, New South Wales, Australia and was buried Glebe Cemetery in Maitland on Nov 18, 1843.

HOUSEBREAKING.

JAMES JULL and WILLIAM PETERS were indicted for stealing 5 guineas, 3 sovereigns, one half-sovereign, a gold ring, a watch, and other property, value 30*l.*, in the dwelling-house of Henry Care, at Cheriton, in last March.

Mr. POLLOCK and Mr. LAW conducted the prosecution, Mr. CLARKSON the defence.

Henry Care swore to the stealing of the money, &c. from his dwelling-house; but admitted, on cross-examination, that a person of the name of Newman, who lived in the same house, had been committed for the robbery.

Samuel Care, the son of the preceding witness, saw James Jull about the premises at the time the robbery was committed.

Sarah Care, wife of Samuel Care, saw the prisoners about the time of the robbery on the border of a wood, a quarter of a mile from Mr. Care's cottage. She was at that time unmarried, and was going to Care's house, and both the prisoners spoke to her and used language which it did not become her to repeat.

Henry Care, junior, also saw the prisoners near the premises, on the Sunday of the robbery; on that day all the family had left the house for a time; the robbers appeared to have got in at the window, as some panes of glass were broken.

Cornelius Fraser saw the prisoners at a public-house at Folkestone, on Sunday, the 30th March last, the day of the robbery; he saw Newman there at the same time, but not in company with the prisoners.

It was further proved that the prisoners, on the Friday after the robbery, asked for change of five guineas, and received it from John Barton, landlord of the Plough public-house, at Folkestone. Barton saw the prisoners at his house, on the Sunday of the robbery, and also on the second Sunday after; and then Jull asked him to change five guineas, which he consented to do; and the guineas were brought him next morning for that purpose. Barton sent the guineas to a Mr. Brunet.

John Barton, son of the last witness, gave the guineas to Pledge, a carrier, between Folkestone and Canterbury; and Pledge gave them to Edward Bennet, son of Mr. Bennet, a brewer, at Canterbury.

John Saunders Bennet, the brewer, received the guineas, and one of them was passed to the Mayor of Folkestone, who produced it; and it was identified by Henry Care, as his property, by particular marks on it.

The guineas having been traced back to the possession of the prisoners, they were taken into custody.

The Jury found both the prisoners Guilty.

She arrived in Sydney, New South Wales, Australia on Sep 1, 1839 (sS Cornwall). She died c. 1854 in New South Wales, Australia and was buried in Cumberland, New South Wales on Aug 14, 1854.

Harriet Peters - Arrival in Australia

Henry Warman Peters c1803 - 1879

Henry was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Standing. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1803. He was baptized at Ss Mary & Eanswith Church on Dec 26, 1803, and married Rowena Atkinson (with whom he had 11 children: Henry Watson, Eliza A, Mary Amelia C, John Wesley, William Fletcher, Frederick Smallwood, Jane Marion, Anne Atkinson, Thomas Albert, Richmond Noble and Rowena Caroline) on Oct 2, 1838 in Richibucto, New Brunswick.

Throughout his life, he lived in Richibucto, New Brunswick in 1861 (relation to Head of House: Head); and in Kent in 1871 (marital Status: Married) (the same place as his father had been living in 1861). He died on Apr 9, 1879 in New Brunswick and was buried at Richibucto Protestant Cemetery, Richibucto, New Brunswick after Apr 9, 1879.

John Peters c1806 - c1840

John was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Standing. He was born c. 1806.

John died c. 1840.

Rachel Peters c1825 - c1900

Rachel was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Standing. She was born c. 1825 and married Horatio Atkinson (with whom she had 2 children: Arthur Bowden and Charles P) on Jul 22, 1847 in New Brunswick, Canada.

Rachel died c. 1900.

Sarah Ann Peters c1812 - c1885

Sarah was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Standing. She was born in Folkestone, Kent, England c. 1812 and married Henry Warman (with whom she had 6 children: Mary Jane, Henry Peters, Charles Peters, William Peters, Eleanor Marsh and Edward) in New Brunswick, Canada.

Sarah died c. 1885.

Stephen Peters c1822 - c1900

Stephen was the child of Henry Peters and Mary Standing. He was born c. 1822. He was baptized in Elham, Kent, England on May 5, 1822.


Stephen died c. 1900.





Eunice was the youngest of 7 children of Richmond Peters, a farmer, and Caroline Warman. She was born in Barkers Point, York, New Brunswick on Sep 10, 1897.

Throughout her life, Eunice lived in several places: in New Brunswick in 1901 (was the daughter of the head of the household); in York in 1911 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Daughter); in Douglas, York on Jun 1, 1921 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Sister); and in York in 1945 (the same place as her mother had been living in 1911). In 1927 she traveled from Hong Kong, China to Victoria, British Columbia, arriving 27 Mar.

Eunice died on Feb 5, 1991 in Fredericton, York.



reconstruction and renovation took place under the ministry of F. A. Wightman, making the church very attractive, the preacher of the day being D. W. Johnson, ex-editor of The Wesleyan, assisted by Revs. H. W. Weddell, T. Marshall, A. D. McLeod, and the pastor.

A Church was built at Lower St. Mary's and dedicated on Dec. 29th, 1876, the preachers being Revs. H. McKeown and R. Wilson, the pastor. The people of this community depended for employment upon the lumber business carried on there, and when the mill ceased to operate the place was practically abandoned and church services were discontinued. After some years of disuse the building was sold and the proceeds devoted to the payment of the mortgage debt.

The first Church at Kingsley was built on the Royal Road, near the Esley Bridge, about 1825, and, until the organization of the Gibson circuit, was supplied from Fredericton. A new church was erected and dedicated, on another site, on Nov. 18th, 1867, during the pastorate of E. C. Turner, the preachers being Revs. J. J. Treadwell, W. W. Brewer, and E. C. Turner.

The church at **Nashwanink** (formerly called Douglas) was erected about 1878. The seeds there grew out of services held in early days by slave leaders and local preachers from Fredericton. For some years in the forties, Presbyterians had two men, and the assistant settled at Douglas and visited other communities on the east side of the river. This Church continues to the present, and having been recently completed renovated, its fine proportions and classic appearance attract admiration. It is the home of a devout and generous people.

The appointed seats on this circuit are Gibson (South Devon), Nashwanink, Kingsley, and Kingsclear. At the opening of the Gibson Circuit, in Oct., 1828, it was announced that it would henceforth be known as the Gibson Memorial Church, in honor of Alexander Gibson who made its erection possible.

The following is the list of ministers: 1825, E. Judson; 1826, R. Wilson; 1827, G. W. Fisher; 1829, M. R. Knight; 1830, J. S. Allen; 1832, W. W. Brewer; 1833, J. A. Clark; 1834, J. Selzer; 1835, H. Sprague; 1836, C. H. Pridley; 1839, J. S. Plimney (Mr. Plimney died in July, 1851, and J. W. McConnell supplied for a year); 1852, Isaac Hewitt; 1853, J. Selzer; 1857, E. C. Turner; 1858, J. Craig; 1859, J. C. Berry; 1858, Thos. Schilling; 1871, C. Finlayson; 1875, A. D. McLeod; 1880, E. E. Thomas; 1881, F. A. Wightman; 1885, J. B. Gough.

A number of worthy Christian workers have gone out from this circuit. Among them was the late Dr. Barker (Melrose), who felt called to the ministry and entered the East Maine Conference, where he labored with much acceptance. One of his sons, who was born here, also entered the ministry. Rev. **David H. Nelson**, of the N. B. and F. E. I. Conference was born here and grew up in the Gibson congregation. His **daughter, Miss Eunice L. Nelson**, is one of our missionaries in China. Margaret Gill Currie, formerly Margaret Gill, the New Brunswick poetess, and the whole Gill family were prominent members of the Gibson circuit.

Kingsclear—The early settlers of this community were mostly Anglicans and Baptists, but there were some estimable people who could not see their way clear to join either communion, so that, when a Methodist minister appeared among them he was given a ready hearing. It came about in this way. In 1832, a young Mr. Kilburn, in visiting relatives in St. John's, was led to attend the preaching of Rev. Knapp Wood, the first Methodist preacher he had ever heard, and he was so impressed both with the personality of the preacher and his message that he interviewed Mr. Wood and urged him to visit Kingsclear. It so happened that, on the following year—1833—Mr. Wood was removed to Fredericton and the young man received his invitation with the result that Mr. Wood made an early visit to Kingsclear and afterwards held a series of special services in which many were converted to God, resulting in the forming of a group, of appointments, in 1834, including Kingsclear and neighboring communities, which were, for many years, supplied by the assistant ministers of the Fredericton circuit and by able local preachers from that city. It appears first as a separate circuit in 1861, with Edwin Evans as its pastor. The Church at Kingsclear was built about 1834. Churches were also erected at Lake George and Long's Creek, Lincoln and Douglas were also for a season connected with Kingsclear.

For a time the circuit flourished. In November, 1880, a handsome church was dedicated at Lincoln, during the pastorate of H. J. Clark, the preachers being Revs. E. Evans (Pastor), D. D. Currie, and W. W. Brewer.

As time passed, this circuit suffered much from death and removal. The Lake George congregation was largely depleted by the closing of the settlement mines, and the few remaining Methodists went in with the Presbyterians, and sold their own

History of Methodism in Eastern British America

Ewart A Peters 1895 - 1914

Ewart was the 6th of 7 children of Richmond Peters, a farmer, and Caroline Warman. He was born in New Brunswick on Apr 4, 1895.

During his life, he lived in St Marys, York, New Brunswick in 1901 (was the son of the head of the household); and in York in 1911 (marital Status: Single; Relation to Head of House: Son) which is where he died on Jun 24, 1914 (died by drowning). Ewart was buried at Bradley-Gill Memorial Cemetery in St Marys after Jun 24, 1914.

Frederick Stanley Peters 1888 - 1916

Frederick was the son of Frederick Peters, a miller, and Celia Colpitts. He was born in Peters Mills, Kent, New Brunswick on Jan 23, 1888.

Throughout his life, Frederick lived in several places: in Richibucto, Kent in 1891 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Fils) and in 1901 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Son); in Kent in 1911 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Son) (the same place as his father had been living in 1881); and in Canada in 1914 and in 1915. He died on Oct 1, 1916 in Rouen, Normandy, France (gunshot wounds to the left arm and scalp.) and was buried there at St. Sever Cemetery after Oct 1, 1916.

Grace was the 2nd of 7 children of Richmond Peters, a farmer, and Caroline Warman. She was born in Smiths Corner, Kent, New Brunswick on Sep 22, 1885.

Throughout her life, Grace lived in several places: in Weldford, Kent on May 28, 1891 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Daughter); in New Brunswick in 1901 (was the daughter of the head of the household); in York, New Brunswick in 1911 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Daughter); and in Douglas, York on Jun 1, 1921 (marital Status: SingleRelation to Head of House: Sister). She died on Feb 15, 1956 and was buried in Saint Marys, York after Feb 15, 1956.



Howard Hepple Peters 1880 - 1962

Throughout his life, Howard lived in several places: in York, New Brunswick in 1911 (marital Status: Single; Relation to Head of House: Son); in Canada in 1915; and in Douglas, York on Jun 1, 1921 (marital Status: Single. Relation to Head of House: Brother). On Nov 27, 1915 he was serving in the military in France (army; 104th Overseas Battalion). He died on Sep 18, 1960 at Victoria Public Hospital, Fredericton, York (cerebral thrombosis) and was buried at Sunny Bank Cemetery, McEvoy Street, Fredericton after Sep 18, 1960.



reconstruction and renovation took place under the ministry of F. A. Wightman, making the church very attractive, the preacher at the day being D. W. Johnson, ex-editor of The Wesleyan, assisted by Revs. R. W. Woodall, T. Marshall, A. D. McLeod, and the pastor.

A Church was built at Lower St. Mary's and dedicated on Dec. 28th, 1878, the presbyters being Revs. H. McKewen and E. Wilson, the pastor. The people of this community depended for employment upon the lumber business carried on there, and when the mill ceased to operate the place was practically abandoned and church services were discontinued. After some years of disuse the building was sold and the proceeds devoted to the payment of the mortgage debt.

The first Church at Kingsley was built on the Royal Road, near the Estey Bridge, about 1825, and, until the organization of the Gibson circuit, was supplied from Fredericton. A new church was erected and dedicated on another site, on Nov. 14th, 1867, during the pastorate of E. C. Turner, the preachers being Revs. J. J. Trusdale, W. W. Brewer, and E. C. Turner.

The church at **Nashwaak** (formerly called Douglas) was erected about 1870. The cause there grew out of services held in early days by class leaders and local preachers from Fredericton. For some years in the forties, Fredericton had two men, and the assistant resided at Douglas and visited other communities on the east side of the river. This Church continues to the present, and having been recently completely renovated, its fine proportions and stately appearance attract admiration. It is the home of a devout and generous people.

The appointments on this circuit are Gibson (South Devon), Nashwaak, Kingsley, and Kingsclear. At the reopening of the Gibson Church, in Oct., 1928, it was announced that it would henceforth be known as the Gibson Memorial Church, in honor of Alexander Gibson who made its services possible.

120 HISTORY OF METHODISM

A number of worthy Christian workers have gone out from this circuit. Among them was the late Dr. Barker (Medical), who felt called to the ministry and entered the East Maine Conference, where he labored with much acceptance. One of his sons, who was born here, also entered the ministry. Rev. **Ovid H. Peters**, of the N. B. and P. E. I. Conference was born here and grew up in the Gibson congregation. His sister, Miss **Dorcas L. Peters**, is one of our missionaries in China. Margaret Gill Currie, formerly Margaret Gill, the New Brunswick poetess, and the whole Gill family were prominent members of the Gibson circuit.

Kingsclear—The early settlers of this community were mostly Anglicans and Baptists, but there were some estimable people who could not see their way clear to join either communion, so that, when a Methodist minister appeared among them he was given a ready hearing. It came about in this way. In 1822, a young Mr. Kilburn, in visiting relatives in St. John, was led to attend the preaching of Rev. Enosh Wood, the first Methodist preacher he had ever heard, and he was so impressed both with the personality of the preacher and his message that he interviewed Mr. Wood and urged him to visit Kingsclear. It so happened that, on the following year—1823—Mr. Wood was removed to Fredericton and the young man renewed his invitation with the result that Mr. Wood made an early visit to Kingsclear and afterwards held a series of special services in which many were converted to God, resulting in the forming of a group of appointments, in 1824, including Kingsclear and neighboring communities, which were, for many years, supplied by the assistant ministers of the Fredericton circuit and by able local preachers from that city. It appears first as a separate circuit in 1861, with Edwin Evans as its pastor. The Church at Kingsclear was built about 1828. Churches were also erected at Lake George and Long's Creek, Lincoln and Douglas were also for a season connected with Kingsclear.

For a time the circuit flourished. In November, 1880, a handsome church was dedicated at Lincoln, during the pastorate of H. J. Clarke, the preachers being Revs. E. Evans (President), D. D. Currie, and W. W. Brewer.

As time passed, this circuit suffered much from deaths and removals. The Lake George congregation was largely depleted by the closing of the railway route, and the few remaining Methodists went in with the Presbyterians, and sold their own

Ross was the son of Harrison Peters and Maria Robertson. He was born in Kamloops District, British Columbia on Oct 20, 1895, and married Alcine Oakes (with whom he had 3 children: Harrison Ross and Delbert Alicen, along with 1 surviving child) in 1920 in Edmonton, Alberta.

Throughout his life, he lived in Humboldt, Saskatchewan in 1906 (relation to Head of House: Son Marital Status: Single) and in 1911 (marital Status: Single Relation to Head of House: Child); and at 907 Howe Street, Vancouver, British Columbia in 1918. That is also where he died on Oct 20, 1986 in Edmonton.

Rowena Elizabeth Peters 1897 - 1978

Rowena was the younger of 2 children of James Peters and Rowena Gray. She was born in New Westminster, British Columbia on Jun 26, 1897, and married Charles Pretty (with whom she had 4 children: Charles Watson, Rowena Charlotte, James Ivan and Elizabeth Anne) on Oct 10, 1917 in New Westminster, Vancouver.

Charles Nelson Pretty and Rowena Elizabeth Peters were married on October 10, 1917. Shortly after, they birthed four children €" Charles Watson, Rowena Charlotte, James Ivan, and Elizabeth Anne (also known as Betty -Anne). Charles and Rowena chose to share a home in Vancouver, BC with Charles' parents. While residing in Vancouver, they were presented an opportunity to purchase a 160- acre parcel of land from a woman, Mrs. Jackson, who had lost her husband, but they

allowed her to stay in her home for as long as she wished. The property had frontage on the Chehalis and Harrison Rivers extending out under the river for some distance. When Charles and Rowena decided to build a home on the property, they would travel by train from Vancouver to Harrison Mills and paddle by canoe to their home on the river! Charles the Businessman Charles Nelson Pretty had business acumen and was extremely entrepreneurial. Originally, he had a Timber Brokerage business with his father, and continued operations for a number of years after his father passed away. To earn additional streams of income, he decided to turn the property into a dairy farm and even purchased extra land from the Aboriginal Band across the river. He also developed a large silvertip fox farm where the cottages are currently located. Charles Nelson Pretty then entered the logging industry and, at one time, it was the largest privately owned logging company in all of B.C. Despite his admirable work ethic, Charles Nelson Pretty balanced his life by spending time with family and friends. If Charles and Rowena weren't hosting friends, as Rowena was known for her amazing culinary abilities, they would spend their time at sea. Charles designed a 52-foot pleasure yacht called the 'Voyageur III'. Spending Time Together as a Family Charles and Rowena had the boat for many years and spent several fun-filled days traveling up the river with their children. Charles build a dock at the front of the house where he moored the boat during the summer in high water season. Charles and Rowena also belonged to the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club where the family enjoyed many wonderful excursions. Constructing the Manor Since BC Hydro had not made its way out to the Fraser Valley, Charles had to build a dam in order to produce electricity for his home and all of the adjacent buildings. It is still in existence today, and used to generate electricity for the Inn. During the winter season of 1947 and 1948, the climate was bitterly cold. One early morning, the barn and workshop caught fire as the flames spread quickly through to the hayloft area. Sadly, the cattle died quickly due to the oxygen being sucked so quickly from the building. The loss was devastating for the family. The only items saved, other than the root-house made of stone, were the dairy walk-in fridge and the freezer room. It was later assumed that the cause of the fire was from leaving too many of the heaters on. Following this disastrous winter was the famous flood of 1948, which mercifully avoided the Pretty property because of the sloped land. Tragedy The eldest daughter, Rowena Charlotte, was tragically killed in a car accident on April, 1968. She was only 45 years old and left behind her husband Christopher Michael Foster Lepine and six children. Five months later, the eldest son, Charles Watson, passed away due to a massive heart attack, and he was was 49 years old, leaving behind his wife Dorthea and two children. In less than six months, Charles Nelson and his wife Rowena lost two of their children! Christopher Lepine, who was named after his father and is one of the six children that Rowena birthed, is the General Manager at Pretty Estates Resort today. Converting the Manor into a Boutique Resort After living a long and wonderful life, Charles Nelson Pretty passed away in 1992 at 102 years of age. The remaining two siblings, James Ivan and Betty- Anne, decided to open their doors and invite the public into their home by converting the manor into a B&B. Having had so many beautiful memories at the estate, they wanted others to enjoy the beauty and tranquility of the property. In 1995, their dream became a reality. Ivan had a dream of building an 18-hole golf course, and so it was implemented. Today, it is called Sandpiper Golf Course. In memory of their mother and sister, they named the inn Rowena's Inn on the River. After Ivan passed away in July 2001, Betty-Anne bought out Ivan's share, and is now the only remaining sibling from that generation. She is the sole owner of the property, and resides with her husband, Doug Faulkner. They both play an active role in the development and decision -making of Pretty Estates along with her nephew, and General Manager, Christopher Lepine.


