

## James Sprat

He married Catherine Tayler (with whom he had 3 children: Mary, James and Ann) on Oct 12, 1755 St Lawrence in Thanet.

### **Ann Sprat c1763 -**

Ann was the child of James Sprat and Catherine Tayler. She was born c. 1763. She was baptized in St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent, England on Apr 4, 1763.

### **Mary Sprat c1758 -**

Mary was the child of James Sprat and Catherine Tayler. She was born c. 1758. She was baptized in St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent, England on Aug 20, 1758.

### **James Spratt c1761 - 1843**

James was the child of James Sprat and Catherine Tayler. He was born in Kent, England c. 1761. He was baptized in St Lawrence, Thanet, Kent, England on Jul 19, 1761, and married Sarah Impett (with whom he had 1 child, William) on Oct 15, 1786 in St Mary Magdalene, Monkton, Kent (<http://www.fadedgenes.co.uk/JohnCOLLINS.html>). On Jun 6, 1841, he lived at Barnshill, Staple, Kent (was age 84). He died in Jan 1843 in Eastry, Kent and was buried in Staple, Kent on Jan 22, 1843.

## Grandchildren

### William Spratt 1789 - 1862

William was the son of James Spratt and Sarah Impett. William worked as a laborer. He was born in Margate, Kent, England on May 14, 1789. He was baptized at St John the Baptist Church on May 31, 1789, and married Mary Hughes (with whom he had 11 children: James, Sarah, William, Sarah, Matilda, Henry, Hope, Charity, Harriet, Mary and Esther) on Oct 8, 1815 in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent (kFHS CD 17/St. Nicholas At Wade, Kent, England).

William spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: in Kent on Mar 8, 1815; at The Street, St Nicholas-at-Wade on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 50); in St Nicholas-at-Wade in 1851; and at The Street, St Nicholas-at-Wade on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 71 and the head of the household). He died on Mar 6, 1862 in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent (inflammation of the lungs).

A title award was awarded to him by James White on 10/10/1839 (<http://www.kentarchaeology.org.uk/Research/Maps/SAW/02.htm>).

### Charity Spratt c1830 - c1831

Charity was the child of William Spratt, a laborer, and Mary Hughes. She was born c. 1830.  
Charity died c. 1831.

### Esther Spratt 1836 - c1885

Esther was the child of William Spratt, a laborer, and Mary Hughes. She was born in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent, England in 1836. She was baptized on Dec 18, 1836, and married George Pointer, a house carpenter, (with whom she had 8 children: Abigail Jane, Augustus, Annie Elizabeth, Alfred G, Albert William, Arthur Thomas, Adelaide Agnes Esther and Alice Mary) there on Oct 14, 1858.

Throughout her life, Esther lived in several places: at The Street in St Nicholas-at-Wade on Jun 6, 1841 (was age 4); at John Street, St Peters, Thanet, Kent on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 24 and the wife of the head of the household); and on Station Road, Birchington, Kent on Apr 3, 1881 (was age 44 and the wife of the head of the household). She died c. Apr 1885 in Thanet, Kent and was buried at All Saints Church, Birchington, Kent on Apr 25, 1885.

### Harriet Spratt c1832 -

Harriet was the child of William Spratt, a laborer, and Mary Hughes. She was born in Kent, England c. 1832. She was baptized in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent, England on Jul 22, 1832, and married Stephen Ralph there on Oct 12, 1857. On Jun 6, 1841, she lived at The Street in St Nicholas-at-Wade (was age 9).

### Henry Spratt c1827 -

Henry was the child of William Spratt, a laborer, and Mary Hughes. He was born in Kent, England c. 1827. He was baptized in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent, England on Feb 22, 1829. On Jun 6, 1841, he lived at The Street in St Nicholas-at-Wade (was age 13).

### Hope Spratt c1830 - c1831

Hope was the child of William Spratt, a laborer, and Mary Hughes. She was born c. 1830.  
Hope died c. 1831.

### James Spratt 1816 - 1895

James was the son of William Spratt, a laborer, and Mary Hughes. James worked as an agricultural laborer. He was born in St Nicholas-at-Wade, Kent, England on May 12, 1816. He was baptized on Jun 16, 1816, and married Sarah Spain (with whom he had 9 children: Eliza, Mary, Emma, Jane, James Henry, John, Charles, William and Alfred) there on Jan 9, 1842 (parish Church/St. Nicholas At Wade, Kent, England).

James spent all of his life in Kent, England. Throughout his life, he lived in several places around the county: at Crump's Farm in St Nicholas-at-Wade on Jun 6, 1841 and on Mar 30, 1851 (was age 34 and the head of the household); at The Row in St Nicholas-at-Wade on Apr 7, 1861 (was age 40 and the head of the household); at Parish Cottage in St Nicholas-at-Wade on Apr 2, 1871 and on Apr 3, 1881; and at The Street in St Nicholas-at-Wade on Apr 5, 1891 (the same place as his father had been living on Apr 7, 1861), when he was living with his daughter Jane following the death of his wife on Jun 7, 1884. He died on Nov 18, 1895 in St Nicholas-at-Wade (apoplexy) and was buried there on Nov 24, 1895 (aged 79yrs. Verified at Margate library 24 Mar 2010).



### DEATH FROM PNEUMONIA.

#### SMACK OWNER'S SON A VICTIM.

News has been received by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Spratt, of 41, Addington-street, to the effect that their second son, Pte. Edwin Percy Spratt, M.T., A.S.C., died from pneumonia following influenza in the No. 10 Clearing Station, France, on November 29th.

It is apparent from details to hand that the young soldier entered hospital some days previously and partly recovered from the effects of influenza. He was allowed out but must have had a relapse, for news of his death was received a few days later.

A native of Ramsgate, the deceased soldier was a talented musician and made music his profession. He resided in civil life at Riverhead, a small village near Sevenoaks, with his wife and one little child and at that time his services were in great demand not only as a church organist but also as a teacher of music. He joined the Army about three years ago and up to the time of entering hospital was in a motor transport workshop in France.

Mr. and Mrs. Spratt's eldest son, Driver Sidney Charles Spratt, also of the A.S.C., was killed in France on June 28th, 1918. The youngest one, 2nd-Lieut. Herbert Jesse Spratt, I.W.T., is at present serving in France and is fortunate to have passed through four years of war without injury.

#### SMACK OWNER'S SUDDEN DEATH

The funeral took place at Eddington Cemetery, Herne Bay, on Monday, of Mr. Charles Spratt, whose death, at the age of 77 years, occurred suddenly, while in the garden of his residence, Sidney-villa, Reculvers-road, Bellingham, last week.

Mr. Spratt, who celebrated his golden wedding in July of this year, had been connected with Ramsgate for sixty years. He was well-known among the fishing fraternity, and was the last of the original smack-owners who made Ramsgate their headquarters before the war. He retired soon after the cessation of hostilities, which had claimed the whole of his fishing fleet.

Actively connected with the fishing industry, Mr. Spratt was a director of the Smackowners' Mutual Benefit Society, the Smackowners' Ice Company and the Coal Company, and was a surveyor of the Ramsgate fishing craft.

Mr. Spratt leaves a widow and one son to mourn their loss. The two eldest sons were killed in the war, while the surviving son, Mr. H. J. Spratt, secretary of the Ramsgate and St. Lawrence Conservative Association, carries on business as a house-furnisher in King-street.

News has been received by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Spratt, of 44, Addington-street, to the effect that their second son, Pte. Edwin Percy Spratt, M.T., A.S.C., died from pneumonia following influenza in the No. 10 Clearing Station, France, on November 28th.  
It is apparent from details to hand that the young soldier entered hospital some days previously and partly recovered from the effects of influenza. He was allowed out but must have had a relapse, for news of his death was received a few days later.  
A native of Ramsgate, the deceased soldier was a talented musician and made music his profession. He resided in civil life at Riverhead, a small village near Sevenoaks, with his wife and one little child and at that time his services were in great demand not only as a church organist but also as a teacher of music. He joined the Army about three years ago and up to the time of entering hospital was in a motor transport workshop in France.  
Mr. and Mrs. Spratt's eldest son, Driver Sidney Charles Spratt, also of the A.S.C., was killed in France on June 28th, 1916. The youngest one, 2nd-Lieut. Herbert Jesse Spratt, I.W.T., is at present serving in France and is fortunate to have passed through four years of war without injury.






Harry Dale Spratt - WW1 - 1







**DEATH FROM PNEUMONIA.**

**SMACK OWNER'S SON A VICTIM.**

News has been received by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Spratt, of 41, Addington-street, to the effect that their second son, Pte. Edwin Percy Spratt, M.T., A.S.C., died from pneumonia following influenza in the No. 10 Clearing Station, France, on November 29th.

It is apparent from details to hand that the young soldier entered hospital some days previously and partly recovered from the effects of influenza. He was allowed out but must have had a relapse, for news of his death was received a few days later.

A native of Ramsgate, the deceased soldier was a talented musician and made music his profession. He resided in civil life at Riverhead, a small village near Sevenoaks, with his wife and one little child and at that time his services were in great demand not only as a church organist but also as a teacher of music. He joined the Army about three years ago and up to the time of entering hospital was in a motor transport workshop in France.

Mr. and Mrs. Spratt's eldest son, Driver Sidney Charles Spratt, also of the A.S.C., was killed in France on June 28th, 1918. The youngest one, 2nd-Lieut. Herbert Jesse Spratt, I.W.T., is at present serving in France and is fortunate to have passed through four years of war without injury.

## Tattoo artist

WHEN you come to think of it, a military tattoo is a very specialised kind of art form—and it takes a very special kind of man to run it.

But T.A. Colonel Douglas Spratt, of Edinburgh, who took on Newcastle's 900 Tattoo arrangements, has been doing the job for 30 years—and it shows.

Yesterday was Col. Spratt's 60th birthday, and he spent the day working at the South Shields office of his firm—he is a director of Crawford's Bakeries—and the evening acting as commentator at the tattoo. He was looking forward to tomorrow's high-spot, a visit of the Norwegian Guards and the salute by King Olav.

Col. Spratt, who is honorary colonel of the 71 (Scottish) Engineer Regiment, a retired from the regular Army as a major. What did he do in the war? "Survived," he says grudgingly.

After he had totted up experience at Edinburgh where he is tattoo lighting director, there were requests from Australia, Tasmania, Denmark and Italy for him to run similar events there. It was his friend Col. George Brown, of Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who sought his help for the 900 celebrations.

With Col. Spratt are colleagues Capt. Ian Scott and Capt. Alex Reid-Peters who have been liaising with

local organisers Lirat, Col. Bob Humeslaw and dancing expert Noel Nicol, who has supervised local Scottish dances.

"The Civic Centre concourse where we are doing the tattoo is a very nice setting, but has just about a third of the area in which we usually work," says Col. Spratt. "We have had to scale everything down, but things have worked quite well in the restricted space."

"The helpfulness and enthusiasm of the local participants has been a great help—you can imagine the difficulties when you see a place for the first time and have to get your ideas into working order within a few hours. The first practice runs are always an absolute shambles."

Had tattoos changed much in 30 years? "We have to keep up with the times," said Col. Spratt. "This time we enlisted Roman legionaries."

Lew disliked the man and merely said that he thought John Gielgud had played in much better a few months before. Olivier could do nothing because he knew if he upset Lew (who had a notoriously short temper) that the spotlight would miss him in future performances. Lew then became Head of Lighting at The Coliseum London but eventually had to give up the work he loved because his eyesight had deteriorated so much. Phyllis died c. May 1939 in Thanet, Kent (TB).



## Reginald John Spratt 1911 - c1988

Reginald was the son of Leonard Spratt, an agricultural laborer, and Rose Dennett. Reginald worked as an aircraft filler assembly. He was born in Thanet, Kent, England on Apr 17, 1911, and married Charlotte Neilson (with whom he had 2 surviving children ) around Feb 1934 in Thanet.

Throughout his life, Reginald lived in several places: at Upper Grove, Margate, Kent in 1924; at 1 Dane Hill, Margate, Kent in 1936; at 33 Binland Grove, Chatham, Kent on Sep 29, 1939 (was the head of the household); on Victoria Avenue, Margate, Kent in 1950; and at 93 Victoria Avenue, Margate, Kent in 1955 and in 1965.

Reginald served in the army from Nov 23, 1929 to Nov 22, 1937 in the The Royal Regiment Of Artillery.

Reginald was apprenticed at the age of 14 to the splendidly named Isle of Thanet Gas Light and Coke Co Ltd. He became a qualified gas fitter and after work in the aircraft industry during the war as a riveter, he set up a business in 1946 with his brother in law and another guy, trading as North Foreland Builders. The business collapsed because in those days building permits were required due to shortage of materials, but a customer who claimed to have the necessary permission lied and then refused to pay their bill. In later years he worked as a plumber (similar to gas fitting) for the Thanet Council.

**TWICE ESCAPED FROM POLICE**  
**Detectives Commended**

Two detective constables who caught a man after he had twice escaped from arrest were commended by the chairman, Mr. N. L. Hall, at the Glasgow Police magistrates court, Glasgow, last week.

The two officers were D/O Mabbey and D/O Wallace.

Before the court were Sergeant John Brown, police inspector, of Waterloo street, Glasgow, and Sergeant James Brown, a detective constable, of Adamson road, St. Peter's, who pleaded guilty to chasing a man named J. W. Mc. McLaughlin in Scotland street.

Sergeant James and D/O Mabbey were told a party had been taken to the police station and that the man was not there. D/O Mabbey chased him and knocked him down, and while being taken to the police and Mabbey made another attempt, but was repulsed.

The struggle was described by D/O Mabbey as "an unusual demand."

It was stated that Brown's house was searched, and two water tanks and gutters which had been stolen from a house in the street, were recovered. The tanks were being held in Brown's house.

It was stated that Brown had two previous convictions, but Brown had a clean record. They asked for the grant of a stipendiary and a warrant and that to be taken into consideration.

For defendants, Mr. R. C. W. W. and the solicitor for the defence was given. One night the two men pulled at five public houses and afterwards stole a whisky and stout, six bottles, getting and were taken. They wanted to get the things back, but did not have a suitable opportunity.

Spratt was fined £10, and Brown £10 and defendants were each ordered to pay costs of £5.

**MODEST BOY HERO**  
**ADOPT'S PLANK REWARD**

A thirteen-year-old boy's pluck and resource in stopping a motorist from driving away with a stolen car, were brought to light by the Chief Constable of Thanet, Mr. Thomas Haycock, at the Police Court on Wednesday.

It was on the morning of 29th November that a large vehicle of a car belonging to Mr. F. C. Richmond, 129, High-street, ran away in Thanet-road while the driver, Arthur Wilson, was driving west. Ronald John Spratt, aged 13 years and 8 months, of 11, Faversham, was walking out of Park-lane at the time and immediately arrested the motorist.

He jumped from his machine, and as the car started he by climbed into it from the rear and seized the motor, which was hanging on the side by the splash board, and succeeded in bringing the car to a standstill in Park-road.

The driver of the large vehicle returned to the road to see the lad get ready to drive on his leave out, at which time the constable was controlling a good traffic. In a statement he made to the police he said, "The lad showed great presence of mind, and his action was very plucky indeed."

In thanking these boys to the Bench, the Chief Constable said Spratt was a "boy hero" and in the course of his duty had been told how to stop a motorist from driving away. The lad used nothing of his own to arrest, and the police had to get him out.

The Mayor (Councillor T. B. Wainwright) presented the constable of the Bench to the lad, who was present in Court, and presented him with a writing tablet on a small tablet of his appreciation, an act which elicited hearty applause.

The Mayor read a letter he had received from the Rev. George Hutchings, in which was stated, "I am proud of you, an son of an old St. Margaret's (Richmond) Young of the town. I should have expected this of you, always brave and unassuming." It was stated that the lad was a champion wrestler and boxer, and was full of the spirit of adventure.

The Mayor was pleased Spratt had received such recognition from the Bench, and hoped he would continue to play the game for there was no doubt that his future would be a happy one.
